Guerrero; and 4 WHERAS, on May 1, 1967 Pan American World Airways landed on 5 Guam with 109 Japanese tourists; and 6 WHEREAS, in that first year Guam recorded 6,000 visitor arrivals; and 7 WHEREAS, in July of 1970 the Guam Tourist Commission was renamed 8 the Guam Visitor's Bureau separated from the Department of Commerce by 9 executive order number 70-24; and 10 WHEREAS, the Guam Visitor's Bureau's mission statement is to 11 efficiently and effectively promote and develop Guam as a safe and satisfying 12 destination for visitors and to derive maximum benefits for the people of 13 Guam was adopted on September 28, 1995 and updated on January 13, 2005; 14 and 15 WHEREAS, as tourism provides over 50% to the Gross Island Product, 16 the industry is considered to be the main contributor to Guam's economy; and 17 now therefore be it 18 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of I Mina'Bente Ocho Na 19 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize 20 and congratulate the Guam Visitor's Bureau for 35 years of efficiently and 21 effectively promoting and developing Guam as a safe and satisfying 22 destination for visitors and to derive maximum benefits for the people of 23 Guam; and be it further 24 RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive
