



BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN (28th Guam Legislature):

WHEREAS, Hurricane Katrina devastated Louisiana on August 29, 2005 at 6:10A.M. (EDP)with 145 MPH winds. It is the third strongest hurricane on record to make land fall on the United States of America leaving thousands of people homeless, without medication, food, water and life's basic necessities; and

WHEREAS, the people of Louisiana felt a tremendous loss, confusion and in many cases desperation after the storm, and are in dire need of assistance to try and comprehend this natural disaster and move forward in restoring their community back if not better to the way things were; and

WHEREAS, the Guam National Guard was call to duty to assist with humanitarian efforts in trying to provide force protection and other community relief efforts to assist the community of Louisiana to return to normalcy as much as possible; and

WHEREAS, the St. Tammany Parish Sheriff's Office responded generously through providing shelter to host the Guam National Guard with accommodations in sleeping quarters, restroom facilities, internet service and hot meals which enable our soldiers to concentrate on their mission and carry out their responsibilities effectively and efficiently; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of the Guam National Guard, together with the community of Louisiana showed tremendous support for each other working together to ensure that the State of Louisiana can be made into a safer haven and better place to live; therefore, be it
