Relative to commending and congratulating the members of Soka Gakkai International (SGI) around the world on their tireless efforts and dedication to promoting world peace and to congratulating SGI-USA, Guam, on the Thirty-second (32nd) Anniversary of its founding, and the grand opening of SGI-USA, Guam Activity Center.

1	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I
2	MINA'BENTE ÑUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
3	WHEREAS, thirty two (32) years ago, on January 26, 1975, one hundred
4	fifty-eight (158) delegates from fifty-one (51) countries met in Islan Guåhan for
5	the first World Peace Conference; and
6	WHEREAS, Islan Guåhan was selected as the venue to conduct the first
7	World Peace Conference because the Chamorro people suffered so terribly
8	from the ravages of war; and
9	WHEREAS, from this auspicious occasion, the delegates founded Soka
10	Gakkai International (SGI), thus beginning a worldwide grassroots movement
11	of peace, education and culture, based on the humanistic outlook of Nichiren
12	Buddhism; and
13	WHEREAS, today SGI is a worldwide network with eighty-two (82)
14	constituent organizations and more than one million two hundred thousand
15	(1,200,000) members in one hundred ninety (190) countries and territories who
16	share a common vision of global peace and prosperity; and
17	WHEREAS, for twenty-six (26) years, SGI has been accredited as a Non-
18	governmental Organization (NGO) by the United Nations (UN); and
19	WHEREAS, as an NGO of the UN, SGI has worked tirelessly with other
20	UN entities in promoting harmony and coexistence between nations,
21	disarmament, human rights and humanitarian relief; and
22	WHEREAS, Mr. Daisaku Ikeda, a recipient of the UN Peace Award and
23	over two hundred (200) honorary doctorates from universities around the
24	world, has been the president of SGI since 1975; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mr. Ikeda has encouraged the members of SGI to devote
- 2 their lives to planting seeds of peace throughout the world, rather than
- 3 seeking to bring the flowers of their own lives to bloom; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the members of SGI resolve to contribute to the prosperity
- 5 of their respective societies and countries, while respecting individual
- 6 cultures, customs and laws; and
- WHEREAS, the members of SGI-USA, Guam, have pursued activities to
- 8 advance the cause of peace; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in January 2000, SGI-USA, Guam, commemorated the
- 10 Twenty-fifth (25th) Anniversary of the founding of SGI by co-sponsoring with
- 11 the University of Guam, Soka University of America and SGI-USA, the first
- 12 Pacific Islands New Millennium Peace Conference; and
- WHEREAS, the conference brought together executive government
- 14 leaders and high chiefs from many of the Pacific Islands to share their
- 15 memories of the Pacific War and to resolve to never again allow such violence;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, in January 2005, SGI-USA, Guam, commemorated the
- 18 Thirtieth (30th) Anniversary of the founding of SGI, by hosting numerous
- 19 commemorative events in the name of peace; and
- WHEREAS, these commemorative events included the opening of two
- 21 (2) traveling exhibitions, "Building a Culture of Peace for the Children of the
- 22 World" and Morehouse College's "Gandhi, King, Ikeda: A Legacy of Building
- 23 Peace," which were displayed at the office of the Governor of Guam, the
- 24 University of Guam, the Guam Community College, FBLG Middle School,

- 1 Upi Elementary School, Simon Sanchez High School and Anderson
- 2 Elementary School; and
- 3 WHEREAS, SGI-USA, Guam, hosted the Second Pacific Islands New
- 4 Millennium Peace Conference for educators focusing on "Humanistic
- 5 Education: Fostering a Culture of Peace" and sponsored a cultural festival
- 6 celebrating the diverse culture of mankind; and
- 7 WHEREAS, on January 13, 2007, SGI-USA, Guam, will observe the
- 8 Thirty-second (32nd) Anniversary of the founding of SGI, with the grand
- 9 opening of its new Activity Center; and
- 10 WHEREAS, SGI-USA Guam will be exhibiting at the Activity Center,
- 11 the Morehouse College's "Gandhi, King, Ikeda: A Legacy of Building Peace"
- 12 exhibit; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the youth members of SGI-USA, Guam, will showcase the
- 14 "Victory over Violence" exhibit to help young people identify and counter the
- 15 root causes of violence in their lives; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of I Mina' Bente Nuebi Na
- 17 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the
- 18 people of Guam, recognize and commend the world-wide members of SGI on
- 19 its tireless efforts and dedication to promoting world peace, and congratulates
- 20 SGI-USA, Guam on the Thirty-second (32nd) Anniversary of the founding of
- 21 SGI, and the grand opening of SGI-USA, Guam, Activity Center; and be it
- 22 further
- 23 RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive
- 24 Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption

- 1 hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mr. Daisaku
- 2 Ikeda, President of Soka Gakkai International; to General Director, SGI-USA;
- 3 to SGI-USA, Guåhan Area; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I
- 4 Maga'lahen Guåhan.
