Relative to congratulating the Knights of Columbus on the occasion of the National Celebration of its One Hundred Twenty-Fifth (125<sup>th</sup>) Anniversary; and recognizing the formation of the local Guam Councils of the Knights of Columbus over forty-two (42) years ago; and further extending a *un dångkolo' na si Yu'os ma'ase'* for its numerous contributions and support to the island community in its unwavering love and commitment for Guam and her people.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, in October 1881, a dream was conceived by Rev. Father
Michael J. McGivney, the curate at St. Mary Church in New Haven,
Connecticut, for the creation of an organization with the purpose of remaining
steadfast in their Catholic religious faith through mutual encouragement, and
to further establish an insurance system that would provide necessary
support and financial assistance to immediate family members upon the death
of their loved ones in the organization; and

WHEREAS, on March 29, 1882, the dream of Fr. McGivney took root and developed into an organization which was granted its charter by the State of Connecticut, and the name of "Knights of Columbus" was chosen by its original deep-rooted Catholic founders as a special tribute to Christopher Columbus, who was a devout Catholic and the discoverer of America. As the Knights of Columbus, its members embodied the ideals of spirituality and service to the Catholic church, country, fellow men, and their families; and

WHEREAS, the Knights of Columbus organization is composed of the Supreme Council, State Councils and Local Councils, that promote and advocate the tremendous importance of spiritual faith in God through Catholicism, and sharing one's personal and professional talents and skills with one's families and the people in their communities; and

WHEREAS, today, the Knights of Columbus through the embodiment of its foremost Catholic ideologies boasts a vibrant, active membership of more than 1.7 million members and their families throughout the United

- 1 States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Guam, the Caribbean,
- 2 Poland, Bahamas, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Saipan, Virgin Islands,
- 3 and Cuba; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the Knights of Columbus, over its many years of existence,
- 5 has maintained its unique strength and stability which have been based on the
- 6 four (4) binding principles of CHARITY, UNITY, FRATERNITY and
- 7 **PATRIOTISM.** This pillar of strength and stability is further reinforced by
- 8 the tremendous successes of the Order's assets and insurance program; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the Knights of Columbus' organizational tenets include the
- 10 following objectives: (1) to support the Catholic Church; (2) to build fraternal
- 11 bonds through social, religious, educational and athletic activities; (3) to
- 12 provide comfort and assistance to the sick, disabled and needy members and
- their families; (4) to reach out to meet community needs and services; and (5)
- 14 to provide financial security to its members and their families; and
- 15 **WHEREAS**, the Knights of Columbus organization is a Catholic family
- 16 fraternal service organization, with its members sharing their time and talents
- in a vigorous program of services and in which its members originate from all
- 18 walks of life, i.e., doctors, lawyers, bricklayers, priests, teachers, farmers,
- 19 clerks, policemen, firefighters, and many others; and
- 20 WHEREAS, in an effort to promote similar ideologies of Catholicism,
- 21 family, and community support, the Guam Knights of Columbus
- 22 organizational affiliate was established in 1965 as a Territorial Council with
- 23 the first, official council on Guam as the San Vitores Council. Over the past
- 24 forty-two (42) years, Guam's membership councils expanded to its present
- 25 day total number of eighteen (18) Local Councils. Due to this tremendous

1 growth in local membership, to include the total number of Councils and the

2 Saipan Councils, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus extended

further recognition to Guam and granted full status as a State, which officially

became Guam State Council No. 99092; and

WHEREAS, the Knights of Columbus' organizational objectives are collectively programmed into various facets of a member's life to include: church, community, council, family, and youth activities. Aside from the Color Corps of the Fourth Degree Knights, the Knights continue to be in close harmony with priests, provide services and maintenance on church buildings and grounds, and support numerous civic and community activities and organizations, i.e., Special Olympic games, the Alee Shelter for battered women and children, Pro-Life Organizational activities, burial of unborn fetuses at Guam Memorial Hospital, Catholic schools, Catholic Social Services, constructing memorials and monuments for unborn children, and numerous other community service activities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, extend its congratulations to the Knights of Columbus on the occasion of the celebration of its National Charter's, One Hundred Twenty-Fifth (125<sup>th</sup>) Anniversary; and further recognizes the Guam Knights of Columbus organization for over forty-two (42) years of existence since its formation, being eventually upgraded and given formal State recognition, known today as the Guam State Council No. 99092, extend a "Un Dångkolo' Na Si Yu'os Ma'ase'" (Thank You Very Much) to the local, national, and international members of the Knights of Columbus for their outstanding
