WHEREAS, Dr. E. Jennifer Weil received her Doctor of Medicine Degree

7 WHEREAS, Dr. Weil's academic experience includes appointments as
8 Assistant Professor at Temple University School of Medicine in Philadelphia,
9 Pennsylvania, and Senior Associate in Medicine at Emory University in
10 Atlanta, Georgia; and

11 WHEREAS, in addition to her academic appointments, Dr. Weil's hospital appointments include, Covering Physician at Cape Cod Hospital, 12 Hyannis, Massachusetts, Consulting Physician at Falmouth Hospital, 13 Falmouth, Massachusetts, Staff Physician - Nephrology at the Joslin Diabetes 14 15 Center of Falmouth, Falmouth, Massachusetts, Attending Physician - Internal Medicine and Nephrology at Temple University Hospital, Philadelphia, 16 Pennsylvania, Research Physician at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center, and a 17 pending appointment as Research Physician at the Hu Hu Kam Memorial 18 19 Hospital in Sacaton, Arizona; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Weil's professional activities are numerous including,
 Internist and Nephrologists at Temple University School of Medicine,
 teaching - attending in Internal Medicine and Emergency Medicine Emory
 University Affiliated Hospital Residents and Morehouse School of Medicine

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Residents, and guest lecturer, at Brown University School of Medicine and
 Emory College in evolutionary medicine; and

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WHEREAS, in addition to her professional experience in academics, Dr. 3 4 Weil also has extensive experience in research including, Principal 5 Investigator - Temple University Medical School, Department of Internal 6 Medicine - The Role of the Renin-Angiotensin System in Euryhaline Fish -7 Pilot Study, Co-Principal Investigator - Evolution of Complex Systems in 8 Simple Organisms - A multi-investigator cooperative agreement for the NASA 9 Astrobiology Institute, Graduate Fellowship, Emory University Department 10 of Anthropology; and

11 WHEREAS, Dr. Weil, in addition to her academic and research 12 experience, has also published works in various book chapters and peer-13 reviewed journals that dealt with kidney diseases among indigenous 14 populations of Oceania, and many others ; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Weil is currently the Staff Clinician at the Diabetes Epidemiology and Clinical Research Section in Phoenix, Arizona, whose scientific mission is to determine the etiology of Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus and its complications - particularly among the Pima Indians of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the information shared by Dr. Weil with the people of
Guam will be very important in our continuing efforts to control diabetes on
Guam; and

WHEREAS, as much as twenty-five (25%) percent of Guam's population
has contracted Type 2 Diabetes, an incurable metabolic disease caused by

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poor diet and a sedentary lifestyle that can lead to blindness, kidney damage,
 nerve damage, poor circulation, limb amputations and heart disease; and

WHEREAS, an estimated sixty (60%) percent of *Chamorros*, or more than
twenty thousand (20,000) *Chamorros* on Guam, have Type 2 Diabetes or the
pre-diabetic condition known as impaired glucose tolerance; and

6 WHEREAS, Dr. Weil's extensive body of academics and research
7 experience in kidney diseases will be very helpful to the community; and

8 WHEREAS, Guam is proud and honored to invite E. Jennifer Weil, M.D. 9 to be a Guest Speaker at the Eight Annual Guam Diabetes Association 10 Conference to share her expertise in the prevention and control of diabetes; 11 now, therefore, be it
