Relative to congratulating the family of the late Mrs. Margaret C. Taylor RN, Ph.D. on the occasion of her induction into the Guam Educator's Hall of Fame, Phi Delta Kappa, Guam Chapter, 2008; and recognizing her thirty-five (35) years of contributions and lifelong dedication towards the improvement of nursing education.

## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF *I* 2 *MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

3 **WHEREAS**, the late Mrs. Margaret C. Taylor RN, Ph.D. was born on 4 August 1937, in a small farming town of Michigan, North Dakota, to John and 5 Nellie Zacha, and was the third child of the two loving parents; and 1 WHEREAS, Margaret, who was fondly addressed by her nickname 2 "Peggy" loved life on the farm as a child, where she nurtured kittens and 3 calves; and

4 WHEREAS, inspired by her Aunt Claire's commitment to care for 5 others, Peggy followed in her aunt's footsteps and joined the nursing 6 profession; and

WHEREAS, Peggy attended St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing in
Fargo, North Dakota, where she graduated from the Registered Nurse
program in 1958; and

10 WHEREAS, after receiving her RN license, she was hired as an 11 instructor at Saint Luke Hospital, and during her tenure, she realized that to 12 help nursing grow, she needed to learn more; and

WHEREAS, Peggy was accepted to the School of Health Sciences at the University of Oregon, where she earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1964; she was then awarded a scholarship to the School of Nursing at the University of Pittsburgh, where she continued her studies earning a Master of Science Degree in 1966; and

18 WHEREAS, after graduating from the University of Pittsburgh, she was 19 a Maternal/Child consultant for the City of Minneapolis. Peggy was always 20 most interested in Parent/Child nursing and she helped the nursing 21 profession develop an understanding of the need to help both mothers and 22 fathers in the nursing care of children; and

WHEREAS, Peggy moved to Saint Petersburg, Florida, where she was
also a nursing consultant when the University of Florida opened a School of

Nursing and she became a charter member of the faculty. She was always
 proud of helping develop a comprehensive nursing curriculum and assisting
 the School of Nursing to receive its first full accreditation; and

WHEREAS, while Peggy was at the University of South Florida she met
her future husband, James Taylor, and the two married in 1977 and later
adopted their two (2) children, Jerry and John; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, she earned a Ph.D. in educational measurements
and statistics from the University of South Florida. As part of her doctoral
program, she developed "DADI", a way of measuring a father's interaction
with his newborn child; and

11 WHEREAS, in 1979, Peggy joined the faculty at West Virginia University 12 as an Associate Professor of Nursing, where she edited the book *Nursing in the* 13 *Year 2000,* a look at what the nursing profession could become, and it was the 14 first time the West Virginia University Press had published a book on nursing; 15 and

16 WHEREAS, before Peggy moved to Guam, she was a Professor at
17 Marymount University, Arlington, Virginia from 1983 to 1991; and

18 WHEREAS, Peggy came to Guam in 1991, and she joined the nursing 19 faculty at the University of Guam (UOG) as an Associate Professor from 1991 20 to 1996, and was the second nurse faculty member to be hired with a 21 Doctorate Degree by UOG; and

WHEREAS, Peggy played a significant role in getting the first full accreditation of the UOG nursing program and she served as a valued mentor to the younger nursing faculty; and 1 WHEREAS, Peggy devoted over thirty-five (35) years of her life to the 2 profession of nursing and the vast majority of those years were spent as a 3 nursing educator; and

WHEREAS, Peggy loved shaping the next generation of nurses and
worked hard to improve the practice of nursing by developing the nursing
theory at each of the schools and colleges at which she was employed, and she
helped the nursing evolve into being a theory-based profession; and

8 WHEREAS, the late Margaret Claire Taylor RN, Ph.D. has been 9 bestowed with the honor of being one of Guam's premier educators by the 10 Guam Chapter of the Phi Delta Kappa and is inducted into the "Guam 11 Educator's Hall of Fame, (2008)"; now, therefore, be it

12 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na* 13 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the 14 people of Guam, congratulate the family of the late Margaret Claire Taylor 15 RN, Ph.D. on the occasion of her induction into the Guam Educator's Hall of 16 Fame, Phi Delta Kappa, Guam Chapter, 2008, and to recognize her for thirty-17 five (35) years of contributions and lifelong dedication towards the 18 improvement of nursing education; and be it further
