WHEREAS, in the summer of 1991, Reverend Rodrick "Rod" P. Calkins 3 and his wife, Sharon L. Calkins, bid farewell to their college-bound son, Kelly, 4 5 packed their belongings and left the creature comforts of their former residence in the City of American Falls, Idaho; and

- 7 WHEREAS, with their school-aged children in tow, Melissa, Jennifer, Tara and Theresa, the family faithfully journeyed to the island of Guam as 8 9 humble servants of God; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Calkins family immersed themselves with the island culture and traditions and quickly adopted the "Hafa Adai Spirit" as Reverend 11 12 and Mrs. Calkins served as Principals at the Trinity Christian School in Yigo 13 beginning in the Fall semester of the academic School Year in 1991 through 14 the conclusion of the 1997 academic school year; and
- 15 WHEREAS, at the behest of many in the island community, Rev. 16 Calkins answered a recognized need to offer a Christ-Centered educational institution to serve the requirements of schoolchildren in the Central part of 17 18 Guam; and
- 19 WHEREAS, in 1998, Reverend and Mrs. Calkins and family established 20 the Guam International Christian Academy (GICA) to serve students in grades K-3 through 12; and 21

1 WHEREAS, GICA adopted the official school colors of Forest Green,

2 Black and White, and sports the image of the great Gator as their school

3 Mascot; and

WHEREAS, testimony to the school's success was an enrollment that peaked at just over three hundred (300) pupils, with a staff and faculty in excess of thirty (30) at any given time; and

WHEREAS, Reverend and Mrs. Calkins operated the GICA campus with an "Open Heart," equally accepting of classroom whiz kids studying college preparatory courses as with schoolchildren dubbed "at-risk" at other schools; and through Christ teachings and unconditional and unyielding care, fused the latter with the former and molded the so-called underachievers into eager learners; and

WHEREAS, the Calkins extended their campus to students in all demographics, and often approved need-based scholarships to families wishing to avail themselves of the best education possible for their children without lengthy paper requirements or questions; and

WHEREAS, in the fall of 2003, the Calkins expanded the Great Gator School System with the purchase of the storied Evangelical Christian Academy (ECA) in Chalan Pago; and

WHEREAS, today, the Guam International Christian Academy and the Evangelical Christian Academy localized to one (1) Campus in Chalan Pago,

- 1 offering distinct Curricula. GICA operated the A BEKA Curriculum, while
- 2 ECA boasts the Accelerated Christian Education Curriculum; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Rev. Calkins, a staunch believer that athletics helps to
- 4 balance academics, offered a humble sports program for students, under his
- 5 direct tutelage, that often produced high caliber student-athletes and several
- 6 championships in various sports; and
- WHEREAS, GICA boasts schoolchildren that have made their mark in
- 8 the world or at other schools, with over two hundred (200) graduates
- 9 comprising the budding Gator alumni group of College Graduates, Blue and
- 10 White Collar Workers, Federal, Military and Local Officers, young business
- 11 owners, Educators, Medical workers, and mid and top level managers and
- 12 private and government workers throughout the island and around the
- 13 world; now, therefore, be it

- 16 people of Guam, commend and congratulate Reverend Rodrick P. Calkins, his
