## **Executive Committee Resolution No. 250**

Relative to congratulating the Palauan Community and the Koror Club of Guam on the auspicious occasion of the Silver Anniversary of the establishment of the Koror State Constitution, Republic of Palau (Belau).

## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF *I* 2 *MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

WHEREAS, the people of Palau, along with the people of Guam, have long shared an ancient history spanning more than four millennia, first greeted British traders and prominent visitors in the 18<sup>th</sup> century; and

6 WHEREAS, in 1783, the English Vessel Antelope, under the command 7 of Captain Henry Wilson, was shipwrecked on a reef off of Palau's Ulong Island, one of the Rock Islands of Koror, and with the help of the Koror High 8 9 Chief Ibedul, Captain Wilson and his crew were welcomed to stay and rebuild their ship, which took approximately three (3) months. Once repairs were 10 11 completed, Chief Ibedul sent his son, Prince Lebuu, back with the sailors to be educated in England. Although Prince Lebuu died of smallpox shortly after 12 13 arriving in London, his presence there touched many Britons and piqued their interest in Palau; and 14

15 WHEREAS, following this significant contact between Palauans and 16 Westerners, more foreign explorers sailed through Palauan waters and the 17 islands were open to further European contact; and

WHEREAS, Germany acquired the Palauan Islands at the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century and handed them over to Japan. After the defeat of Japan in World War II with the costly and historic Battle of Peleliu, which took place from September 15 to November 25, 1944, and took the lives of more than two thousand (2,000) Americans and ten thousand (10,000) Japanese soldiers, the United States gained control over what were then called the Marshall,
 Caroline and Mariana Islands. The islands became part of the United Nations'
 Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, with Palau administered as one of the
 three (3) island groups' six (6) districts; and

5 WHEREAS, after three (3) decades as part of the UN Trust Territory of 6 the Pacific under U.S. administration, this westernmost cluster of the Caroline 7 Islands opted for independence in 1978, rather than join the Federated States 8 of Micronesia; and

9 WHEREAS, on July 9, 1980, the Palau constitution was ratified, and its 10 first constitutional elections were held and the Island nation became known as 11 the Republic of Belau (Palau) in 1981; and

WHEREAS, on October 21, 1983, the Koror State Constitutional
Government was established as one of the Republic's sixteen (16) Island
States; and

WHEREAS, Koror or "Oreor", the largest city in Palau, is where seventy percent (70%) of the Republic's population lives and is the city that hosts most annual festivities and special events for the island nation, and was the site of the capital from independence in 1994 to 2006, when Melekeok became the new capital; and

WHEREAS, the State of Koror has three (3) bridges that connect Malakal
Island, Ngerkebesang Island and Babeldaob, and remains Palau's economic
hub and commercial center, and the country's main city that is the location of

most national government offices, the hospital, high schools, the college,
 churches, hotels, ports and various business establishments; and

3 WHEREAS, a vast array of Palauans who had lived in Koror brought 4 their culture hard work and respect for family and traditions to Guam, their 5 home away from home; and

6 WHEREAS, on October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2008, the Palauan community will celebrate 7 the 25<sup>th</sup> Koror State Constitution Day, a day that commemorates the 8 establishment of their statehood, which was chartered on October 21, 1983; 9 and

10 WHEREAS, this occasion of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Koror State 11 Constitution provides a wonderful opportunity to recognize and celebrate the 12 rich culture of the Palauan community, who have enhanced our Island 13 community; and

14 WHEREAS, the members of the Koror Club are proud to be a strong 15 supporter of the Palauan Community Association of Guam and the general 16 island community by contributing to various educational, sports and 17 community charities over the past several years; and

18 WHEREAS, the members of the Palauan community have continued to 19 enrich our proud tradition of diversity and have endowed our island of Guam 20 with their unique and collective strength; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na
Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the

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people of Guam, commend the Koror Club of Guam and the people of the
Republic of Palau (Belau) on the occasion of their 25<sup>th</sup> Koror State Constitution
Day celebrations, and does further extend a sincere *Un Dangkulo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse* to all our fellow Palauans on Guam for the positive contributions that
they have made for the betterment of our island community; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Executive 6 7 Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter to the Honorable Tommy 8 9 Remengesau, Jr., President of the Republic of Palau; to the Honorable Yoshitaka Adachi, Governor of Koror State; to the Honorable Jeff Kenty, Palau 10 Consul General to Guam; to the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam 11 Delegate to the United States Congress; and to the Honorable Felix P. 12 Camacho, I Maga'lahen Guåhan. 13
