Relative to commending and congratulating Katherine Bordallo Aguon, PH.D., for her many years of service to Guam; and for her lifelong dedication to the perpetuation, preservation, and promotion of the *Chamorro* language, culture, traditions, and identity.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I 2 MINA'BENTE ÑUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Katherine B. Aguon, Ph.D., is married to Edward Leon
Guerrero Aguon, and together they were blessed with eight (8) children:

Ronald, Ernestina, Linda, Josita, Gailey, Barbara, and twins Gena, and
 Baltazar, their spouses, grandchildren and great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, in 1950, Dr. Aguon embarked on a lifelong career as a public servant in the realm of education and educating when, at the age of eighteen (18), she began teaching at the former Sinajana and Agana Elementary Schools and at George Washington High School, among others; and

8 WHEREAS, Dr. Katherine Aguon, with the support of her husband 9 Edward, while raising a family, attained every level of higher education 10 offered, beginning with an Associates of Arts degree, then a Bachelors of Arts 11 degree in Social Science with a minor in English from the University of Guam 12 (UOG), and shortly thereafter, a Masters of Arts degree in Secondary 13 Education with a minor in Administration from the University of San 14 Francisco, California; and

WHEREAS, in June of 1971, Dr. Katherine B. Aguon, now married to Edward for over twenty (20) years and a mother of eight (8), etched her name in Guam history when she became the first woman of *Chamorro* descent to earn a Doctor of Philosophy degree. Dr. Aguon earned her doctorate in Curriculum and Instruction with a minor in Administration from the University of California at Berkeley; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Aguon returned to the island and continued work as an educator as an Associate Professor at UOG and, in 1972, Dr. Aguon marked yet another first for *Chamorro* women when she was tapped to head the

Department of Education, becoming the first *Chamorro* woman to lead a major
 government agency; and

3 WHEREAS, as the head of Department of Education, Dr. Aguon 4 expanded on her promotion of the island's cultures and traditions and 5 preservation of the language by creating the Division of *Chamorro* Studies; by 6 then, Dr. Aguon had already been recognized as one of the foremost 7 authorities on the *Chamorro* culture and language; and

8 WHEREAS, in 1975, Dr. Aguon returned to the University of Guam as a 9 Professor and two (2) years later was elected to serve as a member of the 10 Fourteenth (14th) Guam Legislature; as the lone female of the twenty-one (21) 11 member lawmaking body; she was elected by her colleagues to the position of 12 Vice Speaker, the first woman to be elected to the second most recognized 13 position in the legislature; and she also chaired the Committee on Education; 14 and

WHEREAS, Dr. Aguon was re-elected to the Fifteenth (15th) Guam Legislature and retained her committee chair and position of Vice Speaker; while a lawmaker, Senator Aguon proposed and helped pass laws that created the Guam Community College, laws that championed the rights of women, including the spousal abuse and rape law and community property law, and other laws that continue to impact education and the betterment of society today; and

22 WHEREAS, once again serving as the Director of Education during then 23 Governor Calvo's administration, Dr. Aguon reshaped the island's 24 educational structure to meet the demands of a growing population by

converting junior high schools to senior high schools and creating a handful of
 middle schools. Under her leadership, three (3) high schools, Oceanview,
 Simon Sanchez and Inarajan and six (6) middle schools, Agueda Johnston,
 Dededo, F.B. Leon Guerrero, Piti, Inarajan and L.P. Untalan came into being;
 and

6 WHEREAS, notwithstanding the demands of the various roles Dr. 7 Aguon has filled as a wife, mother, educator, student, writer, legislator, 8 business person, and dedicated public servant, and despite her retirement 9 from government service at UOG as a full professor in 1992, one (1) concept 10 has always remained constant in Dr. Aguon's resolve, her goal of 11 perpetuating, preserving, and promoting the *Chamorro* language, culture, 12 traditions, and identity for today's generation and those to come; and

13 WHEREAS, today, Dr. Aguon completes decades of dedication to 14 ensuring the preservation of the *Chamorro* heritage as the island moves 15 forward in the information age of the twenty-first (21st) century; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Aguon's work with the Department of Chamorro Affairs 16 through the Chamorro Language Commission's Publication, Planning and 17 Research has created a renewed spirit of island pride and preservation 18 19 through works such as Hale'-ta, a series of Chamorro Heritage books and a 20 host of educational undertakings, and other publications as: Chamorro 21 Language and Culture; Let's Chat in Chamorro; The Development of the 22 Chamorro Costume, The Guam Dilemma; Chamorro, A complete Course of Study, Practical Chamorro; and 23

WHEREAS, Dr. Aguon has served with distinction on various boards and commissions, has been honored with a litany of awards including Guam's "Ten Outstanding Women of Government of Guam," and has provided several keynote addresses at Colleges and conventions here and abroad; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Ñuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, commend
and congratulate Dr. Katherine Bordallo Aguon for her many years of service
to Guam; and be it further

10 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Ñuebi Na* 11 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, recognize and thank Dr. Katherine Bordallo 12 Aguon for her lifelong dedication to the perpetuation, preservation, and 13 promotion of the *Chamorro* language, culture, traditions, and identity; and be 14 it further

15 **RESOLVED,** that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Ñuebi Na* 16 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the 17 people of Guam, nominate Dr. Katherine Bordallo Aguon to the *Guma Onra*, 18 The Guam Hall of Fame, for her outstanding lifetime contributions to the 19 people of Guam as an educator, Senator, and cultural preservationist; 20 and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mr. Edward and Dr. Katherine Bordallo Aguon, to each of their eight (8) children; to the
