Relative to recognizing, commending, and congratulating Mrs. Janice Ranae Anderson Chargualaf on her seventeen (17) years of public service to the students of the Guam Public School System.

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I**
2 ***MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS, Mrs. Janice Ranae Anderson Chargualaf was born to Mr.**
4 **Benny and Mrs. Grace Anderson and raised in the village of *Maless*; and**

1 **WHEREAS**, residing now in the village of Yona, she has been married to
2 Kenneth P. Chargualaf for seventeen (17) years and together they have five (5)
3 children, namely Dominic, Shane, Christian, Forrest, and Ana Nicole; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Chargualaf began her studies at Merizo Elementary
5 School and graduated from Notre Dame High School in 1987; and

6 **WHEREAS**, she received a Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood and
7 Elementary Education from the University of Guam in 1993; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Chargualaf then completed her post-graduate studies
9 at the University of Guam, earning a Masters of Education in School
10 Administration and Supervision in 1996; and

11 **WHEREAS**, her work experience in education began as a teacher at
12 M.U. Lujan Elementary School in Yona and continued as a teacher at other
13 schools, including Price Elementary School and Merizo Elementary School;
14 and

15 **WHEREAS**, in July of 1999, she was appointed Acting Assistant
16 Principal at M.U. Lujan Elementary School and, within a year, she was
17 appointed Acting Principal; and

18 **WHEREAS**, in June 2002, Mrs. Chargualaf was selected as the Principal
19 of M.U. Lujan Elementary School, a position she still holds. She is responsible
20 for over nine hundred twenty-five (925) students, and seventy-four (74)
21 faculty and staff; and

22 **WHEREAS**, during her tenure as the Principal at M.U. Lujan
23 Elementary School, the students have achieved several distinctions, including
24 top three (3) in SAT 10 results in the district for School Year 2005 to 2006; the
25 Fourth Graders scored First Place District Wide in Reading & Social Science

1 for School Year 2005 to 2006, and the First and Fourth Graders scored above
2 the National Percentile in Spelling for School Year 2005 to 2006; and

3 **WHEREAS**, under her leadership at M.U. Lujan Elementary School,
4 students continued to excel in SAT 10 results with Third Graders scoring First
5 place District Wide in Reading, Social Science & Listening for School Year
6 2004 to 2005; Fifth Graders scoring above the National Percentile in Spelling;
7 and First Graders scoring above the National Percentile in Reading for School
8 Year 2004 to 2005; and

9 **WHEREAS**, during her career as a teacher, Mrs. Chargualaf participated
10 in and often chaired extra-curricular activities, including the M.U. Lujan
11 Social Committee, Christmas Committee, Family Literacy Committee, School
12 Leadership Committee, and Kindergarten Grade Level; and

13 **WHEREAS**, as a School Administrator, her contributions continued as
14 she participated as a member of the District Level Principal's Leadership
15 Academy Committee, District Level Assistant Principal Pre-Academy
16 Committee, the Guam Education Policy Board, Negotiation Team for the
17 Guam Teachers Contract, and the District Action Plan: Standards &
18 Assessment Committee; and


19 **WHEREAS**, her expertise has resulted in numerous grants being
20 awarded to the island's Public School System for the Pre-K to Fifth Grade
21 Summer Program, Families and Schools Together (FAST) Program, School
22 Action Plan (SAP), Causing All Readers to Excel (CARE), After School
23 Reading Tutorial Program, Saturday Math Tutorial Program, and the School
24 Technology & Teacher Professional Development Grant; and

1 **WHEREAS**, her diligence and persistence resulted in the creation of a
2 long term partnership in which the University of Guam Student/Teacher
3 Training Program sponsored the Saturday Science & Social Studies K-Fifth
4 grade classes and the Physical Education Pre-K to Fifth Grade classes; now,
5 therefore, be it

6 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na*
7 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the
8 people of Guam, recognize, congratulate, and commend Mrs. Janice Ranae
9 Anderson Chargualaf for her dedication, commitment, and professionalism in
10 educating Guam's public school children; and be it further

11 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive
12 Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption
