**Relative to commending Chief Warrant Officer Four (CWO4), Steven E. Taylor for over three (3) decades of service to the United States Navy and congratulating him on his retirement.**

1        **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I**  
2        ***MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3        **WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Four (CWO4), Steven E. Taylor is**  
4        **retiring from the United States Navy on June 1, 2007, ending a distinguished**  
5        **career in service to this nation that has spanned more than thirty (30) years;**  
6        **and**

1           **WHEREAS**, a native of Towanda, Pennsylvania, Steven E. Taylor  
2 enlisted in the U.S. Navy on March 24, 1977 as an Airman; and

3           **WHEREAS**, after completion of boot camp at Great Lakes, Illinois,  
4 Steven E. Taylor attended AT "A" School at Memphis, Tennessee and  
5 Advanced Electronic Warfare Operator (EWOP) School at Pensacola, Florida;  
6 and

7           **WHEREAS**, upon completion of Survival, Evasion, Resistance, and  
8 Escape (SERE) and Deepwater Environmental Survival (DWEST) Training in  
9 San Diego, California, Steven E. Taylor reported for his first aviation tour with  
10 the Fleet Air Reconnaissance Squadron One (VQ-1) at NAS, *Hagåtña*, Guam  
11 from where he was deployed to Japan, Korea, Thailand, Philippines, Diego  
12 Garcia, Africa, Muscat Oman, and Masirah; and

13           **WHEREAS**, during his attachment to VQ-1, Steven E. Taylor flew as a  
14 EWOP and Deepwell Technician, and was designated as a Naval Air  
15 crewman; and

16           **WHEREAS**, in June 1981, Aviation Technician Second Class Petty  
17 Officer (AT2) Taylor reported aboard Patron Four (VP-4) Detachment Special  
18 Projects at NAS Barbers Point, Hawaii, as a EWOP, Radar, and Special  
19 Systems Operator; and

20           **WHEREAS**, during his tour at NAS Barbers Point, Steven E. Taylor  
21 worked both organizational and intermediate level maintenance, and in the  
22 configurations division, made deployments to Alaska, Japan, Korea, Guam,

1 Midway Island, Wake Island, Kwajalen, Diego Garcia, Masirah, Djibouti,  
2 Muscat Oman, Cocos Reeling, and the Philippines. He made modification  
3 and test and evaluation deployments to Patuxent River, Maryland; NADC  
4 Warminister, Pennsylvania; Point Mugu and Moffet Field California; and

5       **WHEREAS**, in October 1988, Aviation Electronics Technician Chief  
6 (ATC) Steven E. Taylor reported to Naval Technical Training Center, Corry  
7 Field, Pensacola, Florida, where he served as Leading Chief Petty Officer and  
8 as an EWOP instructor, and earned his Master Training Specialist; and

9       **WHEREAS**, Steven E. Taylor attended Troy State University,  
10 graduating with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Resources  
11 Management and a Master of Science in Management Degree; and

12       **WHEREAS**, in October 1991, Aviation Electronics Technician Senior  
13 Chief (ATCS) Steven E. Taylor reported as Avionics Division Leading Chief  
14 Petty Officer and Airborne Electronic Supervisor (AES) at VQ-1, NAS *Hagåtña*,  
15 Guam; and

16       **WHEREAS**, Steven E. Taylor was designated as Safe to Release Aircraft  
17 for Flight and NATOPS Instructor for AES, EWOP and Big Look and was  
18 deployed to Japan, Thailand, Diego Garcia, Bahrain, Masirah, Nellis AFB and  
19 NAS Fallon, Nevada; and

20       **WHEREAS**, in November 1994, ATCS Steven E. Taylor reported to VQ-1  
21 Detachment Misawa, Japan, as Command Senior Chief, Maintenance Chief,

1 and as an AES, and was deployed to Okinawa, Guam, Thailand, and  
2 Australia; and

3       **WHEREAS**, Steven E. Taylor has accumulated over seven thousand  
4 (7,000) flight hours; and

5       **WHEREAS**, in December 1997, Avionics Master Chief (AVCM) Steven  
6 E. Taylor reported to Naval Air Facility Misawa, Japan, Aircraft Intermediate  
7 Maintenance Department as Production Control Master Chief. In April 1999,  
8 he took over as the Command Master Chief, Naval Air Facility, Misawa,  
9 Japan; and

10       **WHEREAS**, Master Chief Steven E. Taylor was selected for  
11 advancement to Chief Warrant Officer Three (CWO3) during the Fiscal Year  
12 2000 CWO/LDO selection board. After completion of his training at  
13 Pensacola, Florida, Chief Warrant Officer Steven E. Taylor and his family  
14 proceeded to Helicopter Support Squadron Five (HC-5), at Anderson Air  
15 Force Base, Guam. He served as a Detachment Maintenance Officer on board  
16 USNS SPICA, USNS NIAGARA FALLS, and USNS SAN JOSE, wrapping up  
17 the last year of his tour as squadron Assistant Maintenance Officer (AMO);  
18 and

19       **WHEREAS**, in July 2002, CWO3 Steven E. Taylor reported to USS  
20 KITTY HAWK (CV-63) as the AIMD/IM-3 Division/Avionics Officer and was  
21 promoted to CWO4. He served on the USS KITTY HAWK during Operation  
22 Iraqi Freedom; and

1           **WHEREAS**, in July 2004, CWO4 Steven Taylor transferred to his present  
2 command, HSC-25, and deployed on board USNS GY SGT FRED W  
3 STOCKHAM, USNS FLINT and USNS KISKA; and,

4           **WHEREAS**, after his return, he took over as Homeguard Division  
5 Officer and concluded his thirty (30) years of Naval Service, 1 June 2007, as  
6 AMO; and

7           **WHEREAS**, Chief Warrant Officer Four (CWO4), Steven E. Taylor has  
8 garnered numerous commendations, the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy  
9 and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (with two (2) gold stars), the Navy  
10 and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (with three (3) gold stars), and various  
11 campaign and service medals and ribbons; and

12           **WHEREAS**, for over three (3) decades, Chief Warrant Officer Four  
13 (CWO4), Steven E. Taylor has exemplified the highest standards of the United  
14 States Navy and his efforts in this country's behalf deserve his fellow  
15 citizens' deepest gratitude; and


16           **WHEREAS**, Chief Warrant Officer Four (CWO4), Steven E. Taylor

18 children, Jeremy and Robert, managing to balance life duties in the
