RELATIVE TO CONGRATULATING THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS ON THE OCCASION OF THE NATIONAL CELEBRATION OF ITS ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIFTH **ANNIVERSARY:** RECOGNIZING FORMATION OF THE LOCAL GUAM COUNCILS OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS OVER FORTY-TWO YEARS AGO; AND FURTHER EXTENDING A "DANGKOLO' NA MA'ASE' **ITS NUMEROUS** SI YU'OS **FOR** CONTRIBUTIONS AND SUPPORT TO THE ISLAND **COMMUNITY** ITS **UNWAVERING LOVE** IN COMMITMENT FOR GUAM AND HER PEOPLE.

- 3 WHEREAS, In October 1881, a dream was conceived by Rev. Father
- 4 Michael J. McGivney, the curate at St. Mary Church in New Haven,
- 5 Connecticut for the creation of an organization with the purpose to remain
- 6 steadfast in their catholic and religious faith through mutual
- 7 encouragement, and to further establish an insurance system that would
- 8 provide necessary support and financial assistance to immediate family
- 9 members upon the death of their loved ones in the organization; and
- 10 WHEREAS, On the date of March 29, 1882, the dream of Fr.
- 11 McGivney took root and developed into an organization which was
- 12 granted its charter by the State of Connecticut, and the name of "Knights

of Columbus" was chosen by its original deep-rooted catholic founders as

2 a special tribute to Christopher Columbus, who was a devout Catholic and

3 the discoverer of America. As the Knights of Columbus, its members

embodied the ideals of spirituality and service to the Catholic church,

WHEREAS, The Knights of Columbus organization is composed of the Supreme Council, State Councils and Local Councils, that promote and advocate the tremendous importance of spiritual faith in God through Catholicism, and sharing one's personal and professional talents and skills with one's families and the people in their communities; and

WHEREAS, Today, the Knights of Columbus through the embodiment of its foremost Catholic ideologies boasts a vibrant, active membership of more than 1.7 million members and their families throughout the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Guam, Caribbean, Poland, Bahamas, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Saipan, Virgin Islands, and Cuba; and

WHEREAS, The Knights of Columbus have over its many years of existence has maintained its unique strength and stability which have been based on the four binding principles of CHARITY, UNITY, FRATERNITY, and PATRIOTISM. This pillar of strength and stability is further reinforced by the tremendous successes of the Order's assets and insurance program; and

WHEREAS, The Knights of Columbus' organizational tenets include the following objectives: 1.) To support the Catholic Church, 2.) To build

1 fraternal bonds through social, religious, educational and athletic activities, 2 3.) To provide comfort and assistance to the sick, disabled and needy 3 members and their families, 4.) To reach out to meet community needs and 4 services, and 5.) To provide financial security to its members and their 5 families; and 6 WHEREAS, The Knights of Columbus organization is a Catholic family fraternal service organization, with its members sharing their time 7 8 and talents in a vigorous program of services and in which its members 9 originate from all walks of life, i.e. doctors, lawyers, bricklayers, priests, 10 teachers, farmers, clerks, policemen, firefighters, and many others; and 11 In an effort to promote similar ideologies of WHEREAS, 12 Catholicism, family, and community support, the Guam Knights of 13 Columbus organizational affiliate was established in 1965 as a Territorial Council with the first, official council on Guam as the San Vitores Council. 14 15 Over these past Forty-Two years, Guam's membership councils expanded 16 to its present day total number of eighteen (18) Local Councils. Due to this 17 tremendous growth in local membership, to include the total number of 18 Councils and the Saipan Councils, the Supreme Council of the Knights of 19 Columbus extended further recognition to Guam and granted full status as 20 a State, which officially became Guam State Council No. 99092; and 21 WHEREAS, The Knights of Columbus' organizational objectives are 22 collectively programmed into various facets of a member's life to include: 23 church, community, council, family, and youth activities. Aside from the 24 Color Corps of the Fourth Degree Knights, the Knights continue to be in

close harmony with priests, provide services and maintenance on church buildings and grounds, and support numerous civic and community activities and organizations i.e. Special Olympic games, Alee Shelter for battered women and children, Pro-Life Organizational activities, burial of unborn fetuses at Guam Memorial Hospital, Catholic schools, Catholic Social Services, construct memorials and monuments for unborn children, and numerous other community service activities; now, therefore be it, RESOLVED, that I Mina'Bente Ñuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, extends its congratulations to the KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS on the occasion of the celebration of its
