RELATIVE TO COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE WORLD-WIDE MEMBERS OF SOKA GAKKAI INTERNATIONAL (SGI) ON THEIR TIRELESS EFFORTS AND DEDICATION IN PROMOTING WORLD PEACE AND CONGRATULATES SGI-USA, GUAM ON THE 33RD ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF SGI

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I

- 2 MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- 3 WHEREAS, thirty three (33) years ago, on January 26, 1975, one
- 4 hundred fifty eight (158) delegates from fifty one (51) countries met on Guam
- 5 for the first World Peace Conference at which Soka Gakkai International was
- 6 inaugurated; and

- WHEREAS, Guam was selected as the venue to conduct the first World
- 8 Peace Conference, given that the Chamorro people suffered so terribly from
- 9 the ravages of war; and
- 10 WHEREAS, from this auspicious occasion, the delegates founded Soka

- 1 Gakkai International (SGI), thus began the worldwide grassroots activities of
- 2 peace, education and culture, based on the humanistic outlook of Nichiren
- 3 Buddhism; and
- 4 WHEREAS, today SGI is a worldwide network with eighty two (82)
- 5 constituent organizations and more than twelve million (12,000,000) members
- 6 in one hundred ninety (190) countries and territories, sharing a common
- vision of global peace and prosperity and for twenty eight (28) years has been
- 8 accredited as a Non-governmental Organization (NGO) by the United Nations
- 9 (UN); and
- 10 WHEREAS, as a NGO of the UN, SGI has worked tirelessly with other
- 11 UN entities in promoting harmony and coexistence between nations,
- 12 disarmament, human rights and humanitarian relief; and
- WHEREAS, throughout the 1980s and 1990s, Dr. Ikeda's peace
- proposals addressed such themes as the power of dialogue; the adoption of a
- Universal Declaration Renouncing War; and the need for mutual respect in
- cultural exchange, and he cited the important role of the United Nations in
- 17 maintaining global security, while challenging it to become more
- 18 representative of the people and not just nation states; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Dr. Ikeda, who has attained the status of a world-
- 20 renowned Buddhist scholar and peace activist, has made it his personal
- 21 mission to engage in more than one thousand five hundred (1,500) dialogues
- 22 for peace with such noted world leaders as Dr. Arnold Toynbee; Nobel
- 23 Laureate and former President of South Africa Nelson Mandela; former U.S.
- 24 Secretary of State Henry Kissinger; former Soviet Union President Mikhail

1 Gorbachev; civil rights leader Rosa Parks; and Dr. Elise Boulding; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Ikeda, the recipient of two hundred-eleven (211) 2 honorary doctorates since May of 2007 and a recipient of the UN Peace 3 Awards has used the principles of Nichiren Buddhism throughout his own 4 life and in his role as president of SGI where he acts to support the 5 membership in a number of ways, including providing support and 6 encouragement through his writings and lectures, by striving to promote a 7 dialogue on Nichiren Buddhist principles as they apply to today's global 8 challenges, and as such, Dr. Ikeda is viewed as a great role model by millions 9 of people around the world for how to apply this practice in their own lives, 10 and is often referred to by some members as their "mentor in life"; and 11

WHEREAS, Dr. Ikeda has encouraged the members of SGI to devote their lives to planting seeds of peace throughout the world, rather than seeking to bring the flowers of their own lives to bloom; and

WHEREAS, the members of the SGI resolve to contribute to the prosperity of their respective societies and countries, while respecting individual cultures, customs and laws; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Daisaku Ikeda and Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda have received worldwide recognition for fulfilling the dreams of Mr. Tsunesaburo Makiguchi and Mr. Josei Toda, with the establishment of the Soka Education system, which includes elementary to university-level institutions in Japan, and Soka University of America located in Aliso Viejo, California, the establishment of the Min-On Concert Association, and the creation of the Tokyo Fuji Art Museum; and

WHEREAS, the members of SGI-USA, Guam have pursued activities to advance the cause of peace in dedication to the commitment by Dr. Ikeda including the donations of numerous books to the Nieves M. Flores Memorial Library, the University of Guam Tan Siu Lin Library, and the Guam Community College Library; and

WHEREAS, on January 2000, SGI-USA, Guam commemorated the 25th anniversary of the founding of SGI, by co-sponsoring with the University of Guam, Soka University of America and SGI-USA the first Pacific Islands New Millennium Peace Conference

WHEREAS, the conference brought together heads of states and high chiefs from many of the Pacific Islands to share their memories of the Pacific War and resolve to never again allow such violence; and

WHEREAS, on January 2005, SGI-USA, Guam commemorated the 30th anniversary of the founding of SGI, by hosting numerous commemorative events in the name of peace, including the opening of two (2) traveling exhibitions, "Building a Culture of Peace for the Children of the World" and Morehouse College's "Gandhi, King, Ikeda: A Legacy of Building Peace which was co-sponsored by the Guam Martin Luther King Jr. Human Rights Commission, these traveling exhibits were displayed at the Main Conference Room of the Governor of Guam, the University of Guam and the Guam Community College; and

WHEREAS, SGI-USA, Guam hosted the Second Pacific Islands New Millennium Peace Conference for educators focusing on "Humanistic Education: Fostering a Culture of Peace" and sponsored a cultural

festival celebrating the diverse culture of mankind which was attended by state education leaders and philosophical and religious leaders; and

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2007, SGI-USA, on its 32nd anniversary of the founding of SGI, Guam, another milestone was realized with the grand opening of its new Activity Center, something that the members of SGI-USA, Guam have been working hard for years in order to accommodate their Buddhist activities; and

WHEREAS, on January 26, 2008, SGI-USA, Guam will celebrate another landmark occasion with the celebration of the 33rd anniversary of the inauguration of SGI; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Daisaku Ikeda and Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda have dedicated more than sixty-years of their lives to the promotion of peace, culture, and education through their committed efforts as leaders of SGI and continues to serve as inspiring examples of how one person's committed efforts can transform the lives of millions of people around the world including those of us here on Guam; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend the worldwide members of SGI on it's tireless efforts and dedication in promoting world peace, which is ever more relevant in this era of terror and war, and congratulates SGI-USA, Guam on the 33rd anniversary of the founding of SGI; and be it further

- RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to President Daisaku Ikeda of Soka Gakkai International (SGI); to Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda; to
- 5 SGI-USA; to SGI-USA, Guam, and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I
- 6 Maga'lahen Guåhan.
