- 3 WHEREAS, the membership of AARP, Inc. Guam Chapter 4837 grew
- 4 from sixty (60) members to the current two hundred as a result of goals and
- 5 objectives followed through by Mr. Vinancio C. Atalig; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Vinancio C. Atalig diligently exerted himself to have
- 7 the organization recognized at the national level of the AARP West Region of
- 8 which the Guam Chapter is a member; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Atalig, in 2006, established AARP Chapter Month
- 10 celebrated every September to include a proclamation by I Maga'lahen Guåhan,
- 11 a congratulatory resolution from I Liheslaturan Guåhan, and a gala banquet;

- WHEREAS, the AARP Guam Chapter 4837 continues its participation in
- 14 the Guam Liberation Day activities started in 2006; the first AARP, Inc. Guam
- 15 Chapter 4837 town hall meeting with high-level staff from the AARP West
- 16 Regional was conducted in 2006, 2007 and 2008; and

WHEREAS, the organization conducted the first gubernatorial debate in 2006 for the Democrat and Republican party candidates in 2006; since 2004, partnership was established with the Department of Public Health and Social Services, Division of Senior Citizens and continue to provide volunteer work assisting with numerous functions and issues pertaining to Medicare, Medicaid, Prescription Drug, and the Medicare Seniors Patrol to prevent waste, fraud and abuse and annual participates in the Governor's Conference on Aging; and WHEREAS, AARP, Inc. Chapter 4837, in August 2007, initiated soliciting the services of the American Association for Public Opinion

soliciting the services of the American Association for Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) to conduct a survey of Guam Residents ages 50+ on behalf of the AARP, Inc. Guam Chapter of which 800 residents were surveyed with survey results indicating residents fifty (50) years of age and older are highly concerned about health care coverage, becoming a victim of identity theft and affording energy and utility services; and

WHEREAS, nearly three-quarters of respondents of the World War II Loyalty Recognition Act survey strongly supported the survivors of the Japanese invasion of Guam to receive financial compensation from the United States Government; and

WHEREAS, the AARP Guam Chapter 4837 provided testimony in support of Resolution No. 68 (EC) requesting the United States Governor to extend the application and coverage of Medicate entitlements to eligible Guam recipients who have earned Medicare benefits and who choose to obtain quality health and medical services in the Philippines which was

- 2 AARP Guam Chapter 4837 additionally passed a resolution supporting the
- 3 plight of the "Lola COLA" recipients having it published in the Pacific Daily
- 4 News; and
- 5 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Vinancio C. Atalig was instrumental in having benefits
- 6 extended to its members as well as to the national members of the AARP
- 7 living on Guam embracing the AARP Medicare Supplement Plan
- 8 underwritten by United HealthCare Insurance Company encompassing
- 9 benefits not covered by Medicare; AARP Life Insurance underwritten by New
- 10 York Life Insurance Company providing guaranteed coverage up to
- 11 \$150,000.00 regardless of health to AARP members up to age eighty (80); and
- WHEREAS, AARP members now receive additional benefits coverage
- 13 under the AARP Lifetime Income Program designed specifically to provide
- 14 fixed immediate annuities backed by new York Life Insurance and Annuity
- 15 Corporation that help protect members against the risk of outliving their
- 16 savings; and
- WHEREAS, the AARP Driver Safety Program taught by AARP-trained
- 18 volunteers was implemented in November 2007 providing a refresher course
- 19 for drivers age fifty (50) and older with emphasis on safety on today's road
- 20 conditions which upon completion of the course and certification may entitle
- 21 members to insurance discounts; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Vinancio C. Atalig successfully negotiated AARP
- 23 members discounts and services from Avis, Budget, Alamo, Hertz and
