8 WHEREAS, Special Olympics Guam, a non-profit organization, was

established in 1976 and in 1977 held its first Special Olympics games at John F.

10 Kennedy High School with one hundred fifty (150) athletes participating in

various sports; and

12 WHEREAS, the mission of Special Olympics Guam is to provide year-

13 round sports training and competition on a variety of Olympic-type sports for

individuals with special needs, giving them continuing opportunities to

develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy and participate

- 1 in a sharing of gifts, skills, and friendship with their families, other Special
- 2 Olympic athletes and the community; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Special Olympics Guam athletes participated in the
- 4 Hawaiian State Games in 1978, in the 5th International Summer Special
- 5 Olympics Games held at the State University of New York in 1977, and in
- 6 1980, Guam became the first "foreign" team to participate in the Hong Kong
- 7 State Games; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Special Olympics Guam continues to participate in off-
- 9 island Olympics including the 8th International Summer Special Olympics
- 10 Games held in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Minnesota, one of the largest special
- sporting events in the world consisting of six thousand (6,000) athletes from
- more than one hundred (100) countries; and
- 13 **WHEREAS**, the island community, government, and corporate
- 14 organizations have supported Special Olympics Guam for many years by
- 15 providing more games and opportunities to improve services and treatment
- and establishing a more just community; and
- 17 **WHEREAS**, in 2002, the First Annual Law Enforcement Torch Run was
