BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, addressing the complex emotional and behavioral mental health needs of children, youth and families is fundamental to the future of our island and the need for comprehensive, coordinated mental health services for our community –especially children- calls for our leaders, policy makers, child-serving agencies and the whole community to work together; and

WHEREAS, children and youth with mental health challenges and their families deserve access to services and support that are family driven, youth guided and culturally appropriate; and

WHEREAS, mental health is essential to one's overall health and well being and serious emotional and mental health disorders in children and youth are real and treatable; and

WHEREAS, early diagnosis and appropriate treatment of mental health disorders among children and adolescents provide them better opportunities

to lead full and productive lives, but it is important that children and adolescents, along with their families and the community learn about the warning signs of mental health disorders and where to obtain necessary assistance and treatment; and

WHEREAS, for the past 4 years, over 600 children and youth have been referred to the Child-Adolescent Services Division for mental health service, 526 of this are for *I Famagu'on-ta*, a Child Mental Health Initiative for children and youth suffering from severe mental health conditions and are in need of multiple mental health and related services; and

WHEREAS, I Famagu'on-ta, Guam's System of Care, through its unique strength and solution-based, culturally competent, and child centered and family-driven wraparound approach to serving children and adolescents, is effectively caring for the mental health needs of children, youth and families in our community; and

WHEREAS, in celebrating National Children's Mental Health Awareness Week –also Green Ribbon Week- it is fitting to increase public awareness among all people living on Guam of this issue and diminish the stigma associated with mental illness; and

WHEREAS, as we support *Project I Famagu'on-ta* and the remarkable efforts of the Child-Adolescent Services Division of the Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse, *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* encourages its members, support staff and their families, and all of the people of Guam to wear a green ribbon to promote awareness to this issue and to signify new life, new growth and new beginnings; now, therefore, be it
