- WHEREAS, the late Mrs. Margaret C. Taylor RN, Ph.D. was born on
- 4 August 1937, in a small farming town of Michigan, North Dakota, to John and
- 5 Nellie Zacha, she was the third child of two loving parents; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Margaret, who was fondly addressed by her nickname
- 7 Peggy, loved life on the farm as a child, where she nurtured kittens and
- 8 calves; and
- 9 WHEREAS, inspired by her Aunt Claire's commitment to care for
- others, Peggy followed her aunt's footsteps and joined the nursing profession;

WHEREAS, Peggy attended St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing in 1 Fargo, North Dakota, where she graduated from the Registered Nurse 2 3 program in 1958, WHEREAS, after receiving her RN license, she was hired as an 4 instructor at Saint's Luke's Hospital, during her tenure she realized that to 5 help nursing grow she needed to learn more; and 6 WHEREAS, Peggy was accepted to the School of Health Sciences at the 7 University of Oregon, where she earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1964, 8 then she was awarded a scholarship to the School of Nursing at the University 9 of Pittsburgh where continued her studies to earn a Master of Science Degree 10 in 1966, 11 WHEREAS, after graduating from the University of Pittsburgh, she was 12 a Maternal/Child consultant for the city of Minneapolis, Peggy was always 13 most interested in Parent/Child nursing and she helped the nursing 14 profession develop an understanding of the need to help both mothers and 15 fathers in the nursing care of children; and 16 WHEREAS, Peggy moved to Saint Petersburg, Florida where she was 17 also a nursing consultant, when the University of Florida opened a School of 18 Nursing she became a charter member of the faculty, she was always proud of 19 helping develop a comprehensive nursing curriculum and assisting the School 20 of Nursing to receive its first full accreditation; and 21 WHEREAS, while Peggy was at University of South Florida she met her 22 future husband James Taylor, the two married in 1977 and later adopted their 23

two children, Jerry and John; and

WHEREAS, in 1982 she earned a Ph.D. in educational measurements 1 and statistics from the University of South Florida. As part of her doctoral 2 program, she developed "DADI", a way of measuring a father's interaction 3 with his newborn child; and 4 WHEREAS, in 1979 Peggy joined the faculty at West Virginia University 5 as an associate professor of nursing, where she edited the book Nursing in the 6 Year 2000, a look at what the nursing profession could become, it was the first 7 time the West Virginia University Press has published a book on nursing; and 8 WHEREAS, before Peggy moved to Guam she was a professor at 9 Marymount University, Arlington, Virginia from 1983 to 1991; and 10 WHEREAS, Peggy came to Guam in 1991, she joined the nursing faculty 11 at the University of Guam ("UOG") as an associate professor from 1991 to 12 1996 and was, the second nurse faculty member to be hired with a doctorate 13 degree by UOG; and 14 15

WHEREAS, Peggy played a significant role in getting the first full accreditation of the UOG nursing program and she served as valued mentor to the younger nursing faculty; and
