- 3 WHEREAS, Felisa Borja Gutierrez is the daughter of Ignacio Borja and

- 5 daughters Rebecca, Milessa, Cassandra, Lorretta, Clarissa, and Michele; and
- 6 WHEREAS, with the support of her parents and college scholarships,
- 7 Felisa was the first from both sides of her family to earn a higher education
- 8 degree; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Felisa has been a tremendous inspiration to other members

of her family to seek higher education, with all of her children having 1 obtained a Bachelor's degree, two of which have earned a Master's degree and 2 one a Juris Doctorate degree; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Felisa attended Wisconsin State College and earned a Bachelor's degree in Education in 1955, and a Master's degree in School 5 6 Administration and Supervision from the University of Guam in 1973; and WHEREAS, after earning her Bachelor's degree, Felisa returned to 7 Guam to begin a long and diverse career in education beginning in 1955 and 8 culminating with her retirement in 1992, a total of thirty seven (37) years of 9 service; and 10 WHEREAS, Felisa began her career in education teaching in Guam's 11 high schools from 1955 to 1968; and 12 WHEREAS, in addition to her teaching assignments, Felisa taught 13 English as a second language as part of the Department of Education's Adult 14 Basic Education Program; and 15 WHEREAS, in 1969, Felisa would move from the classroom to the 16 Department of Education's Personnel Division to work as a teacher placement 17 officer; and 18 WHEREAS, in 1972, Felisa became assistant principal at George 19 Washington High School for one year, from 1973 to 1976, she was principal of 20 Barrigada Junior High, in 1977, she returned to the Department of Education 21 central office and became the Associate Superintendent of Personnel Services 22

Division for fifteen (15) years where she would stay until her retirement after

37 years of service to the government of Guam working tirelessly to improve
