Relative to recognizing and commending Chief Petty Officer Douglas Samp, United States Coast Guard, for his outstanding contributions to the safety of Guam's residents and visitors through his work with the Search and Rescue Service (SAR) Group Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I MINA 'BENTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Chief Petty Officer Douglas Samp was assigned to Coast Guard Sector Guam as its Communications Unit Supervisor from July 2005 through July 2007, and currently serves as the Command Center Supervisor from July 2007 until June 2008; and

WHEREAS, Chief Petty Officer Samp was assigned to be the Chair, SAR Group Guam from July 2007-June 2008, and is tasked with the organization and coordination of the SAR Group Guam, a multi-agency SAR training and response coordination organization; and

WHEREAS, after identifying the poor VHF radio coverage along seventy-five percent (75%) of Guam's coastline, Chief Petty Officer Samp successfully secured funds to create a portable communications "go-kit" that provided on-scene VHF and satellite communications; and

WHEREAS, the go-kit was deployed on eighteen (18) missions for a total of twenty-four (24) days, resulting in unified efforts amongst the Coast Guard, the U.S. Navy, the Guam Fire Department, the Guam Police Department, and other SAR response agencies, and also realizing a streamlining of operations and the elimination of duplicated effort; and

WHEREAS, as chairman of SAR Group Guam, Chief Petty Officer Samp saw the need to expand the group's membership and invited the government of Guam's Department of Parks and Recreation Lifeguards and the Air Force Rescue unit at Andersen AFB to become members; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the need to upgrade the skills of Guam's lifeguard services to provide improved water safety response for residents and visitors alike, he was able to lobby and convince the Guam Visitors Bureau to underwrite a portion of the costs of providing personal

watercraft and open ocean lifeguard training for local agencies by world class lifeguards from the states of Hawaii and California; and

WHEREAS, all of the efforts put forth by Chief Petty Officer Samp have not only increased the level of lifesaving services on Guam, but have also highlighted the need to share resources and training techniques across the units deployed throughout the island; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina 'Bente Nuebi na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby recognize Chief Petty Officer Douglas Samp, USCG for his outstanding contributions to the safety of Guam's residents and visitors through his work with the Search and Rescue Service (SAR) Group Guam; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina 'Bente Nuebi na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the people of Guam, commends Chief Petty Officer Samp for taking the initiative to go beyond his official duties and responsibilities by spearheading the upgrading of skills of Guam's lifesaving services; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Chief Petty Officer Douglas Samp, Command Center Supervisor, US Coast Guard Sector Guam; to LT Marcus Hirschberg, Command Center Chief, US Coast Guard Sector Guam; to the Guam Visitors Bureau; to the members of the SAR Group Guam; and to Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga 'lahen Guåhan*.
