WHEREAS, The SKIP Entertainment Company was founded in 1982 as a Non-profit organization, Children's Productions. Prior to the birth of SKIP, Children's Productions first staged a number of childrens musicals including "Swinging on a Star, "Candy Man," and "High Hopes." The focus soon turned to dance, giving thousands of Guam's youth an opportunity to excel and learn with instructors and choreographers from Los Angeles and New York City and after staging several

musical productions and being invited to perform for the International Congress of Pediatrics in Honolulu in 1986, opening for Natalie Cole on Guam and changing the group's name to SKIP Entertainment Company in 1990; and WHEREAS, in 1985 SKIP completed their first U.S. Mainland tour, and since that time has traveled to dance competitions and performances in the U.S. Mainland, Europe and Australia every year since that time SKIP Entertainment Company proudly represents Guam in international competitions; and WHEREAS, in 1991, members of SKIP performed on International Star Search, aired in over 63 countries. During the summer of 1993, four SKIP dancers were selected to attend the first "Winners" Showcase, organized by Tony Selznick, in Los Angeles which was aired in California. Later that year, SKIP was once again selected to appear on Ed McMahon's Star Search. That same year, SKIP dancers were featured on the cover of PERFORMER'S EDGE, a national dance publication.; and WHEREAS, from 1991 through 1998, SKIP have participated and won National Dance Championships held in various cities around the U.S. including the 1996 Jazz Dance World Congress held at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. where SKIP won the International Choreographic Leo's Gold Award. Due to this honor, SKIP was selected as featured performers at the 1997 Jazz Dance World Congress in Weisbaden, Germany; and WHEREAS, in addition to winning numerous national and world championship titles, many SKIP Dancers have gone on to prestigious professional dance careers, including SKIP dancer, Michael Lomeka, the first and only Guam trained dancer to graduate from the prestigious Juilliard School of Dance in New York City. SKIP was honored to present Mikhail Baryshnikov and the White Oak Dance Project, including Lomeka, to sold out audiences, on Guam in March 2001. In August 2003,

SKIP dancer Tony Francisco was selected to tour and perform with Britney Spears. who continues to tour with Latin Pop Star, Paulina Rubio. Other notable SKIP alumni, include Tammy Torres-Hunter, formerly the dance captain for the Disney World Lion Kingdom Show; and WHEREAS, after a week of grueling competition among some of the toughest and most talented dancers from Canada, Mexico, Japan, Germany, Italy, Portugal, Poland, Nepal, Austria, the SKIP Entertainment Company did bring honor and pride to Guam once again as winners in both Junior and Senior Canadian National Championships in Vancouver, B.C. with the highest three scores awarded during the entire competition in the Junior Division (Below the age of 12) and the Senior Division (ages 13 and above) and were named overall Champions; and WHEREAS, after a week of grueling competition among some of the toughest and most talented dancers from Canada, Mexico, Japan, Germany, Italy, Portugal, Poland, Nepal, Austria, the SKIP Entertainment Company did bring honor and pride to Guam once again as winners in both Junior and Senior Canadian National Championships in Vancouver, B.C. with the highest three scores awarded during the entire competition in the Junior Division (Below the age of 12) and the Senior Division (ages 13 and above) and were named overall Champions; and WHEREAS, following the exhausting Canadian finals, the group then traveled to Las Vegas for the Star Power National Finals and during the preliminary competition of more than 1,500 entrants, SKIP won the most First Place platinum awards in their categories and placed Fourth overall in the competition; now, therefore, be it
