4 (14TH) ANNUAL CELEBRATION OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, *Palau*, with an ancient history spanning more than four millennia, greeted British traders, prominent visitors in the 18th century, followed by expanding Spanish influence in the 19th-century. Following defeat in the Spanish-American War, Spain, Belau (Palau) and most of the rest of the Caroline Islands then fell under German control in 1899; and

WHEREAS, control then passed to Japan in 1914, when during World War II the islands were taken by the United States in 1944, with the costly Battle of Peleliu

1 between September 15 and November 25 with more than 2,000 Americans and 2 10,000 Japanese killed. The islands passed formally to the United States under 3 United Nations auspices in 1947 as part of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands; 4 and 5 WHEREAS, After three decades as part of the UN Trust Territory of the Pacific 6 under US administration, this westernmost cluster of the Caroline Islands opted for 7 independence in 1978 rather than join the Federated States of Micronesia and 8 became the Republic of Belau (Palau) in 1981; and 9 WHEREAS, Belau (Palau), adopted a constitutional government in a Compact of Free 10 Association with the United States being approved in 1986 after eight referendums 11 and an amendment to the Palauan constitution. The compact was not ratified until 12 1993, and entered into with the United States on October 1, 1994, which marked Belau's 13 independence; and 14 WHEREAS, The Republic of Palau with its main island Babeldaob (Babelthuap), is 15 an island nation in the northern Pacific Ocean, located east of the Philippines, and 16 perched on the Kyushu-Palau Ridge. The westernmost cluster of the Caroline 17 Islands consists of 20 large islands and 566 smaller islands and is one of the world's 18 youngest and least populated nations; and 19 WHEREAS, the splendor of this tropical wonder of nature, emerald green islands 20 stretching more than 400 spectacular miles across pristine azure waters, is a Pacific 21 jewel of limestone coral reefs rising majestically from the sea, undercut by ocean 22 currents and chiseled by nature and time, creating the stunning, world-famous Rock 23 Islands of Belau (Palau), a marvel of nature; and 24 WHEREAS, Belau (Palau), was named the number one Underwater Wonder of the 25 World by Conservation, Education, Diving, Awareness and Marine-Research (CEDAM) 26 International, an organization of divers, marine scientists and conservationists.

1 spectacular scuba diving locales, with coral reefs, blue holes, WWII wrecks, hidden 2 caves and tunnels and over 60 vertical drop-offs are found in Belau where three 3 major ocean currents meet to create an environment of abundance and enormous 4 variety of marine life; the waters surrounding the Rock Islands literally teem with 5 over 1500 varieties of reef and pelagic fish and more than four times the number of 6 coral species found in the Caribbean; and 7 WHEREAS, this tiny nation, a world leader in the global struggle to save our planet, 8 stands tall among the nations setting new standards for environmental stewardship 9 and nature conservancy which has contributed enormously towards the progress 10 the people of Belau, the Traditional Leadership, the Government, and President 11 Tommy Remengesau, Jr. have made together towards developing a thriving and 12 prosperous tourism industry and a vibrant future based on cultural integrity and 13 natural resources; and 14 WHEREAS, Belau's wealth is not just found in its natural resources, but also in a 15 blessing of human resources, a well-educated and highly talented population, 16 using the most modern technology and development techniques to weave these 17 sources of natural and human wealth together to promote, protect and develop the 18 most important resource of all: the traditions, culture, and history of a free people, 19 the independent nation of the Republic of Belau; now, therefore, be it 20 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan 21 Guåhan (the 29th Guam Legislature) does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan 22 and the people of Guam commend the people of the Republic of Belau (Palau) on the 23 occasion of their 14th Independence Day celebrations; and be it further

the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to
