1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF I 2 MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, while government can provide much support for children and 4 youth, it cannot provide the love a child needs. Thirty-seven years ago, the need to 5 provide services to runaway, homeless and troubled youth was made a reality by 6 Father Robert Phelps and Mr. Luis Martinez. They recognized the necessity for 7 children and youth oriented programs and services on our island; and

8 WHEREAS, in 1971, a tax exempt organization whose primary mission is 9 "Helping Youth and Families Help Themselves," was incorporated with the 10 government of Guam; and

11 WHEREAS, since its creation, Sanctuary, Incorporated has remained at the 12 forefront of providing comprehensive services to runaway, homeless, and troubled 13 children and youth and their families. Throughout the years, Sanctuary, Incorporated 14 has continually expanded their programs to better address the needs of our island's 15 children who confront issues such as physical and emotional abuse, sexual abuse,

gang involvement, negative peer pressure and substance abuse. Sanctuary
Incorporated has created an environment that instills important values, builds strong
character, and provides sound education for our children and youth. With a firm
foundation, our children and youth will be better able to face the challenges of the
future; and

6 WHEREAS, in 1987, the Board of Directors of Sanctuary, Inc. worked 7 enthusiastically to provide support programs that now include a twenty-four (24) hour 8 Crisis Hotline, Co-ed Emergency Shelter Facilities, a Transitional Living Program, a 9 Parent Support Group, Parenting Skills Classes, a Community Outreach Prevention Education & Development (COPED), Drug & Alcohol Support Groups, Tobacco 10 11 Cessation and Self-Esteem Groups for Youth, Youth & Adult Anger Management Groups, the Fan Macho'cho Economic Development Project, the AmeriCorps 12 13 Program and Sagan Na'Homlo', the only residential drug and alcohol treatment 14 program for youth in the Western Pacific; and

WHEREAS, in 1987 the Board of Directors of Sanctuary, Incorporated, recognized the need for youth participation in all facets of the organization. As a result, the YES (Youth Embracing Sanctuary) Crew was established. The YES Crew, comprised of former clients and various policy making committees, helps with the fundraising activities, and serves as a source of peer counselors and facilitators; and

WHEREAS, Sanctuary has instilled values, built character and provided education for the youth and their families, while at the same time, encouraging island residents to join in various seminars and conferences throughout the month of November to help educate others about Sanctuary's services; and

WHEREAS, in July 2008, Sanctuary was granted a full three-year national accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, also known as CARF; now, therefore, be it 1 **RESOLVED,** that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na* 2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people 3 of Guam, in recognition of Sanctuary, Incorporated's Thirty-seventh (37th) 4 Anniversary of service to the people of Guam does hereby commend and congratulate 5 the management and staff of Sanctuary, Incorporated; and be it further
