BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the Guam Chapter of the Association of Government Accountants (AGA) is a professional organization, belonging to the Association of Government Accountants which has more than 15,000 members in 90 chapters in the United States and around the world and approximately 100 active members representing local and private sector accountants, auditors, and financial managers in Guam; and

9 WHEREAS, AGA - Guam Chapter members have responded to AGA's

mission of Advancing Government Accountability, as it continues its broad
educational efforts, with emphasis on high standards of conduct, honor, and
character in its Code of Ethics, and are making significant advances both in
professional ability and in service to Guam by mastering increasingly
technical and complex requirements,; and

6 WHEREAS, governments are fully recognizing the importance of 7 professional financial management in times when revenue bases are no longer 8 growing, yet governments are expected to provide more programs, and the 9 taxpayers want more value. The Association of Government Accountants' 10 Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) is a response to this call for 11 professionals who can lead the way to a more accountable, effective 12 government; and

13 WHEREAS, the Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) program of AGA provides a means of demonstrating professionalism and 14 competency by requiring CGFM candidates to have appropriate educational 15 16 and employment history and to pass a 3-part examination requiring expertise 17 in The Government Environment, Governmental Financial Management and Control, and Governmental Accounting, Financial Reporting and Budgeting, 18 and requires each CGFM holder to maintain certification by completing 19 comprehensive training sessions totaling 80 hours over a 2-year period. 20

WHEREAS, since its inception in 1994, the CGFM has become the standard by which government financial management professionals are measured. Its education, experience and ethics requirements have served to elevate the most seasoned financial professionals. The CGFM program spans

the public, private and academic sectors in the United States and abroad. It recognizes the unique skills and experience of government financial management professionals. It identifies those who have knowledge in many functional areas and can apply it in a government setting; and now therefore be it

6 **RESOLVED**, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na* 7 *Liheslaturan Guahan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* and the 8 people of Guam, commend and congratulate the Guam Chapter of the 9 Association of Government Accountants for their efforts in improving 10 government accounting standards on Guam through the Certified 11 Government Financial Manager Program; and be it further
