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Footnotes: Bill 101 (COR) seeks to amend Chapter 90, Title 10, GCA, Regulation of Smoking to prohibited the smoking within 20 feet of the entrance or exit of enclosed public areas. The addition of these prohibited areas may provide for additional revenues for penalties and fines issued. Currently, fines assessed for violations in buses, taxicabs and other means of public transportation and public transportation waiting areas are deposited to the Police Service Fund and all other violations are collected and deposited to the Superior Court of Guam. The bill has a potential for additional revenues and opeational expenditures, however, the impact cannot be determined at this time.
