1. Guam Highway Fund Unreserved Fund Balance is based on Audited FY 2009 Financial Statements.

Bill 432-30 (LS) proposes the annual set-aside of \$1,525,631 from the General Fund (Section 30) and \$6,024,475 from the Guam Highway Fund, respectively to service the debt for the USDA loan. It is noted that this annual debt service requirement could change as loan terms, conditions, and associated costs are finalized.

Nearly \$31 million of the average Section 30 receipts of \$45 million annually is pledged for the Limited Obligation Bond, Series A, 2001, the 2002 Short-Term Financing, Limited Obligation Bond, Series A, 2009, and 2008 Term Financing. Any additional pledge against Section 30 will reduce Guam's debt ceiling and severely impact general operational requirements which the balance of this source currently supports.

The Guam Highway Fund averages \$19 million in collections annually. Of this amount, \$6.5 million currently supports the debt service for the Limited Obligation Highway Refunding Bonds, 2001 Series A (\$6 million) and UOG CIPs (\$500,000). The balance of \$13M currently supports the operations of the Department of Public Works and the Guam Regional Transit Authority as well as village streetlights and the Guam Highway Fund single andit. Any additional pledge against Guam Highway Fund will severely impact general operational requirements which the balance of this source currently supports.
