Bill No. 499-31 has the potential of improving the hospitals revenue collections/cash flow by mandating Health Plan Administrator(s) to pay within fourteen (14) days of the submission of billings by Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), at minimum, Eighty Percent (80%) to the GMHA. In addition, if a Health Plan Administrator fails to pay within fourteen (14) days, then, interest shall be allowed to accrue beginning on the fourteenth day after the date of the billing, at a rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum. It should be noted that the aforementioned provisions will only be enforceable, in the event the GMHA out-sources its Billing and Collections activity(ies) to a private contractor.
