## Bureau of Budget & Management Research Attachment to Fiscal Note No. 528-31 (COR)

## Comments:

The proposed legislation is to add a new Chapter 58C to Title 5 GCA cited as the Yellow School Bus Procurement Act of 2012. A fiscal impact will result in connection with the proposed municipal lease authorization with a contractor for the procurement of at least 123 school busses of which 13 are specifically for students with special needs. The Lease-Back Period is to be mutually agreed upon as may be necessary to amortize the costs associated with the financing, procurement, and preventative maintenance of the busses; however, which shall not be greater than 10 years and with an interest rate not to exceed 4%. Renewal of the lease is subject to the extent that pledged revenue are assigned by the contractor, as appropriate to facilitate issuance of the tax-exempt obligations, or other financial instruments or alternative financing. Rental payments under the lease and the lease-back may be secured by a pledge or other reservation of revenues received by or on behalf of the Government of Guam from the Federal Government per Section 30 of the Guam Organic Act (48 U.S.C.A., Section 1421h, limited to \$1,717,448 per year during the Lease-Back Period). Section 58C109 as proposed, provides for corrective and consumable repairs which shall be under a separate agreement (separate cost) which is not provided under the preventative maintenance agreement with the contractor. Additional impacts may result which cannot be determined at this time, to include determination of the best buy for the government whether through lease of busses, or through government purchase. Section 58C108 as proposed, identifies "rental payments" under the lease, and as such, it may be construed that the busses under the proposed municipal lease are intended not to be government-owned by the end of the municipal lease period (i.e. no specific language that busses are intended to be government-owned). Based on current information, an estimated cost of \$110,000 and maintenance of \$10,000, or a total of \$120,000, is the cost per bus (i.e. bulk purchase). This amounts to an estimate of \$1,200,000 per year for 10 government-owned busses which has been applied for under a grant application by the Department of Public Works.
