Comments on Bill No. 107-32

The proposed legislation is seeking to incarcerate a person who has committed any violent or aggravated felony for life without any mitigation of the prison sentence as the result of a previous conviction of the same or similar violent or aggravated felony crime.

Currently, the prison population is approximately 700 inmates today to include those in the lockup facility in Hagatna. The original inmate capacity of the Mangilao Correction Center was less than 100 and for the Hagatna lockup was 30 inmates. Today, due to piecemeal installations from the main facility, the Mangilao Correction facility is able to expand the inmate population to 600 and the Hagatna lockup facility to 80 inmates. How much more inmates can be incarcerated in both facilities still needs to be determined, but not by much, given the initial capacities of both facilities. Should this Act be passed, a new prison facility would be needed to house the addition influx of new prisoners. The estimated funding requirement for such new facility and land could be as high as \$40 Million.

Additionally, more correctional officers would be needed as the inmate population increases. Currently the Department of Correction has a staff of approximately 156 Correction Officers to monitor the prison inmates at both facilities. However, this staff level is still insufficient to cover the required 24/7 schedule required of such operation, resulting in high overtime cost of approximately \$2.0 Million as of June 2013 of this fiscal year. The FY 2013 Appropriation for the Department of Correction is \$15.7 Million for the General Fund net of de-appropriation and another \$951,661 for Special Funds for a total aggregate amount of approximately \$16.7 Million of this amount \$14.7 Million is for personnel service cost to include salary, retirement and other benefits. This personnel service cost could increase by as much as 20% in next two to three years should this Act be passed.

The passage of this Act would directly influences the number of inmates incarcerated with the Department of Correction, resulting in increased Correction Officers and perhaps a new correctional facility compound in the foreseeable future.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION TO CHAPTER 80, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING A "TWO STRIKES" PROVISION FOR HABITUAL OFFENDERS OF SERIOUS CRIMES.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that

there has been a sharp increase in violent and serious crimes. I Liheslaturan Guåhan

further finds that many of these violent crimes are committed again and again by

persons previously convicted of other serious crimes. These habitual offenders have

shown that rehabilitation for them is not an option. As such, it is in the people's best

interest that habitual offenders be incarcerated for a significant period of time.

Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to implement a habitual

offender statute by adding a new Section to Chapter 80, Title 9, Guam Code

10 Annotated.

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Section 2. The new Section to be added shall read as follows:

1	<u>Habitual Offenders</u>
2	A. Notwithstanding any provision that establishes a shorter term of
3	imprisonment, a person who has been convicted of committing or attempting or
4	conspiring to commit any violent or aggravated felony and who has previously
5	been convicted of a violent or aggravated felony not committed on the same
6	occasion and separated by intervening arrest shall be sentenced to imprisonment
7	for life and is not eligible for suspension of sentence, probation, or parole or
8	<u>release</u> .
9	B. In order for this penalty under this section to apply, both of the
10	following must occur:
11	1. Judgment for the aggravated or violent felony that comprises the
12	prior conviction shall have been entered within fifteen (15) years of the
13	conviction for the current offense, however time spent in custody or on
14	probation for an offense or while the person is an absconder shall not be
15	excluded from the calculation of the fifteen (15) years.
