COMMENTS on Bill No: 151-32(COR)

Bill 151-32(COR) proposes to add a new subsection (A) to §77114.1 and §77115 of Article 1, Chapter 77, Title 21 GCA relative to fees and revenue from concessions and uses. More specifically, granting a waiver to any vendor, eligible by the specifications outlined within this Bill, selling products and/or services deemed "culturally exclusive" of Guam and/or displays an officially licensed Guam Seal.

According to information received from the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR), the current Park Permit Vendor listing for FY13 indicate a total of three (3) vendors that meet the criteria within proposed legislation. Each Park Permit Vendor fee is a flat rate of \$1,500, per annum, per each vendor. Of the three (3) vendors deemed qualified by DPR, only one (1) vendor has established a current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with DPR and does not pay any vendor fees at this time. The grand total of prospective waived fees would amount to \$1,500 (per annum) x 2 (vendors) = \$3,000 in potential annual revenue to be forfeited by proposed legislation, where presently, fees are being collected and deposited into the Public Recreation Services Fund.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 77114.1 of Article 1, Chapter 77, Title 21 Guam Code Annotated is
hereby amended to read:

4 "§ 77114.1 Fees. The Parks and Recreation Commission (the "Commission")
5 may collect fees, charges and assessments for the following:

The use of park shelters, pavilions and open areas by the public and by park vendors, 6 7 the use of recreation facilities, sign-up fees, concession, billboards, equipment rentals, 8 facility rentals, overnight camping fees, and commercial photography fees as 9 established by the Commission. The Commission shall establish a fee schedule for the foregoing uses of the Guam Territorial Park System and recreational facilities. All 10 11 such fee schedules shall be adopted in compliance with the Administrative 12 Adjudication Law. All fees collected under such schedules shall be deposited into the Fund. Any fee schedule and the Recreation Activity Revolving fee schedule adopted 13 by the Commission prior to the enactment of this 26012.1 shall remain in effect until 14 altered and may be so altered or modified by the Commission only after public 15

hearing on any proposed changes, in compliance with the Administrative Adjudication
 Law.

3 a.) The Commission shall develop a policy specific to vendors wishing to do business within our Territorial Park system whose services showcase the 4 island's cultural heritage, history and legacy; and who offer products "Made in 5Guam" that have the Guam Product Seal permit, or showcase Guam's livestock 6 7 such as the Carabao and other animals historically identified with the island, and agricultural products grown locally and activities identified with Guam. 8 9 All offerings by these vendors such as handmade products, park rides, and or 10 photo opportunities shall demonstrate cultural practices, craftsmanship, and 11 design readily identified in Guam's history that showcase the island's heritage, 12 history, and legacy. These vendors shall be exempt from fees; however, the 13 Commission may establish terms and conditions specific to these vendors as

- b.) The Commission may limit the number and type of vendors per park, in
 accordance with its administrative rules and regulations, whose services

Section 2. § 77115 of Article 1, Chapter 77, Title 21 Guam Code Annotated is hereby
amended to read:

21 "§ 77115. Revenue from Concessions and Uses.

The Director is authorized to grant permits to individuals or groups to establish concessions on or otherwise use any part of the Guam Territorial Park System, the fees for which shall be deposited in the Parks Fund; provided, that any person or group granted such a permit shall not be required to give bond or obtain products liability insurance or personal injury liability insurance.

1	a.) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, vendors wishing to do business
2	within our Territorial Park system, whose services showcase the island's
3	cultural heritage, history and legacy; and who offer products "Made in Guam"
4	that have the Guam Product Seal permit, or showcase Guam's livestock such as
5	the Carabao and other animals historically identified with the island, and
6	agricultural products grown locally and activities identified with Guam, shall be
7	exempt from vendor fees assigned by the Department of Parks and Recreation.
8	All offerings by these vendors such as handmade products, park rides, and or
