BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH
COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 258-32 (COR)

The proposed legislation is aimed at the following: adding a new Section 4122 to Chapter 4, Title 5, GCA; amending Sections 22704(a) and 22704(c) of Chapter 22, Title 5, GCA; and adding Section 3(d) to Public Law 30-37.

The addition of Section 4122 to Chapter 4 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated would discontinue the ability of Executive Branch departments to “contract, agree, or certify as to having funds available for the purchase, lease-to-own, and/or lease purchase of real property”. Section 4122 would also give the power of purchasing or leasing real property to the Legislature. The ability to purchase and lease real property is a function of the Executive Branch, not a Legislative function.

There are a few amendments made to Sections 22704(a) and 22704(c) of Chapter 22, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated. The main amendments include restricting the Governor of Guam to leasing real property past the length of his term in office and including payments for leases through tax credits to be implemented in each fiscal year’s appropriation act. The Governor’s authority to purchase and/or lease real property is vested in the Organic Act of Guam and various court decisions, which upholds the doctrine of separation of powers. Therefore, the proposed language to amend Sections 22704(a) and 22704(c) to limit the Governor of Guam to the length of term on lease agreements is assuming the executive function of the Governor of Guam, which is inconsistent with the Organic Act of Guam and existing court precedents (*Government of Guam v. USA* [D.C. Guam 1982], *Civil Case No. 82-0001*; *People v. Camacho*, Sup. Ct. Guam, 1 Guam R.501 [1975]; and followed by *Attorney General of Guam v. Superior Court [Flores, Real Property]*, D.C. Guam, Civil Case No. 79-153 [1980]).

The addition of Section 3(d) to Public Law 30-37 establishes limits on eligibility of being awarded the ability to use tax credits. Section 3(d) states that any elected or appointed official of the Government of Guam that executed the lease involving tax credits and his/her blood relatives to the third degree are not entitled to receiving tax credits.

Although the proposed legislation is administrative in nature, there is still a possible fiscal impact in the long run. Purchasing real property through tax credits necessarily lowers the Business Privilege Tax to be received by the Department of Revenue & Taxation. There would not be a significant impact for this fiscal year, but the tax credit will be deducted from the gross revenue amounts in future fiscal years for the length of the lease’s term.

Dear Madam Speaker,

Attached is Bill No. 258-32 (COR), *An act to add a new Section 4122 to Chapter 4 and to amend Sections 22704(a) and (c), Chapter 22 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated and to add Section 3(d) to Public Law 30-37, relative to requiring legislative appropriation for the government of Guam purchase, lease-to-own, and/or other lease-purchase of real property and for other purposes*, which I have **vetoed**.

Bill 258-32 is inorganic because it intrudes upon the executive authority of the Governor to execute lease agreements on behalf of the government. Bill 258-32 does this by limiting the term of any such lease agreement to the remaining term of the sitting Governor. Such a limitation not only creates an absurd result, but more importantly also prevents the Government from obtaining the best value for the Territory. Government solicitations for office space always include a demand that the landlord/bidder provide certain amenities which require the landlord to engage in a substantial amount of renovation. A landlord responding to a solicitation by the government for office space facilities must be assured that the government is committed to a minimum tenancy long enough for the landlord to recover his costs. Limiting the term of lease agreements to the ever daily changing term of the sitting Governor makes such assurances impossible, and consequently drives up the cost of the lease.

Additionally, Bill 258-32 is further inorganic and unconstitutional because it requires that amendments made to existing lease agreements be entered into only after a sealed bid advertising. A lease agreement is a binding contract which the parties have the freedom and right to amend if they so choose. Regardless of the amount or term length involved, requiring that amendments to an existing contract be re-solicited as a new procurement is an impairment upon the parties' right to contract. In the case of *Pangelinan v. Gutierrez*, 2004 Guam 16, the Guam Supreme Court held that legislation aimed at impairing or preventing the performance of a government contract constitutes an illegal violation of Section 1421b(j) of the Contracts Clause

of the Organic Act which provides that, “[n]o . . . law impairing the obligation of contracts shall be enacted.”





BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 **Section 1.** A new § 4122 is hereby *added* to Chapter 4, Title 5, Guam
2 Code Annotated, to read:

3 “§ 4122. **Legislative Authorization and Appropriation**
4 **Required.**

5 No agency head, certifying officer, or department or agency of the
6 government of Guam shall contract, agree, or certify as to having funds
7 available for the purchase, lease-to-own, and/or lease-purchase of real
8 property without legislative authorization and appropriation. For the
9 purposes of this Section, real property will have the same definition as
10 defined in Article 1, Chapter 1, Division 1, Title 21 of the Guam Code
11 Annotated.”

12 **Section 2.** Subsections (a) and (c) of § 22704 of Article 7, Chapter 22 of
13 Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, are hereby *amended* to read:

14 “(a) *I Maga’lahi* (the Governor) is authorized to acquire on behalf of
15 the government of Guam, by lease, office space and other facilities for the
16 purpose of providing office and other space for the departments and agencies
17 of the executive branch of the government of Guam. Such lease agreements
18 may be negotiated and entered into by *I Maga’lahi* with any person,
19 partnership, corporation, or public or private entity, provided, that no such
20 lease agreement shall exceed the term of the sitting Governor, without
21 specific legislative approval and authorization, and that such lease
22 agreement annual payments *shall only* be made pursuant to an appropriation
23 and/or authorization by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* in each fiscal year
24 appropriation act. No annual lease payments with tax credits shall be made
25 without authorization from *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* in each fiscal year
26 appropriation act.”

1 “(c) All lease agreements or amendments to such lease agreements
2 that are proposed to be entered into pursuant to Subsection (a) hereof, where
3 the total sum of money to be paid or sum of tax credits authorized to the
4 same lessor shall exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), or the total
5 number of years involved shall exceed the remaining years of the term of the
6 sitting governor, may be entered into only after advertising for sealed bids in
7 a newspaper of general circulation within Guam, fourteen (14) days prior to
8 the formal bid opening, and then only to the lowest responsible bidder.”

9 **Section 3.** A new Subsection (d) is hereby *added* to Section 3 of Public
10 Law 30-37 to read:

11 “(d) **Conflicts Prohibited.** Notwithstanding the provisions in this
12 Act, no covered person, as such term is defined below, shall be eligible to be
13 assigned or transferred, in whole or in part, any tax credit authorized in this
14 Act by the Lessor nor shall any covered person be authorized to utilize tax
15 credits granted in this Act. For purposes of this Section, the term *covered*
16 *person shall* mean any:

17 (1) official of the government of Guam that executed or
18 participated in the execution of the lease or any amendments to the
19 lease on or after June 1, 2011; and

20 (2) person or spouse of such person related by consanguinity
21 of the third degree, which for the purposes of this Act *shall* include
22 spouses, all children, parents, grandchildren, siblings, grandparents,
23 great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, uncles, aunts, and great-
24 grandparents, to any person described in Subsection (1) of this
25 Section.”

26 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

1 **Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provisions of this Act or the application
2 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity *shall not*
3 affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect
4 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
5 Act are severable.





1 **Section 1.** Section 4122 is hereby *added* to Chapter 4, Title 5 of the Guam

3 “§ 4122. **Legislative Authorization and Appropriation Required.**

4 No agency head, certifying officer, or department or agency of the
