1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that crimes committed against any individual, no matter how large or how small, is not acceptable. However, certain groups of people are more vulnerable to falling victim to crime. It is impendent on the government to ensure that these "vulnerable victims" are given the utmost protection and recourse under the law.

7 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish a vulnerable
8 victims sentencing enhancement for individuals who commit crimes against especially
9 vulnerable individuals in our society.

Section 2. §80.37.6 of Chapter 80, Title 9 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *added* to read:

"§80.37.6. Vulnerable Victim Sentencing Enhancement.

(a) Whoever commits or attempts to commit upon a vulnerable victim, a
violent felony as defined in 9 G.C.A. §80.70, or Theft as a Second Degree or
