Comments

The intent of this bill is to provide for individuals with intent to provide verbal false statements to mislead a public servant to be guilty of a misdemeanor. The fiscal impact in the passage of this bill will be possible imprisonment if individual is found guilty of a misdemeanor. Title 9 GCA, Chapter 80, §80.34 notes the courts may set a maximum term not to exceed one (1) year for an individual convicted of a misdemeanor. This new offense and the imprisonment requirement will have an effect on operational costs to all law enforcement departments/agencies. As an example, cost for the Department of Correction for a conviction resulting in a 12 months sentence will result in costs totaling \$36,500 per person. (Average cost of inmate per day is \$100)

§ 80.34. Misdemeanor & Petty Misdemeanor Sentences.

Except as otherwise provided by § 80.36, a person who has been convicted of a misdemeanor or a petty misdemeanor may be sentenced to imprisonment, as follows:

- (a) in the case of a misdemeanor, the court shall set a maximum term not to exceed one (1) year;
- (b) in the case of a petty misdemeanor, the court shall set a definite term not to exceed sixty (60) days.

COMMENT: § 80.34 provides the basic terms of imprisonment which may be imposed upon a conviction for a misdemeanor or petty misdemeanor. Under Subsection (a) only a maximum term is provided. The Parole Board will determine the actual release date. Under Subsection (b), the sentencing judge sets a definite term and the Parole Board is neither required nor permitted to change the release date so established.

MINA' TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN 2014 (SECOND) Regular Session

Bill No. 30/- 32/ 0012

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Introduced by:	Brant T. McCreadie
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AN ACT TO AMEND § 52.30 OF CHAPTER 52 TITLE 9 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE CRIME OF UNSWORN FALSIFICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 3 Police officers, Customs officers and a whole range of other public servants rely on 4 interviews and verbal questioning to obtain needed information in the performance of their official duties. However, it is an inevitable reality that government officials 5 6 discover that persons knowingly mislead public servants in the course of an interview 7 or interrogation. As it stands under current Guam law however, the crime of Unsworn 8 Falsification does not include a provision for a person who verbally misleads a public 9 servant while performing official duties. By adding a provision that sets a punishment 10 for verbal Unsworn Falsifications, Guam peace officers will have the ability to arrest 11 those who verbally mislead them with the intent of committing an action against the 12 welfare of the people of Guam. 13

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to add a provision to establish a penalty for individuals who make verbal Unsworn Falsifications by amending § 52.30 of Chapter 52, Title 9 Guam Code Annotated.

Section 2. § 52.30 of Chapter 52, Title 9 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

1	"§ 52.30. Unsworn Falsifications; Defined & Punished.
2	A person is guilty of a misdemeanor if, with intent to mislead a public
3	servant in performing his official function, he makes, submits or uses:
4	(a) any written false statement of his own which he does not then believe
5	to be true; or
6	(b) any verbally provided false statement of his own which he does not
7	then believe to be true; or
8	(b) (c) any physical object, exhibit, writing or drawing which he knows to
9	be either false or not what it purports to be in the circumstances in which it is
10	made, submitted or used."
11	Section 3. Effective Date. This act shall be effective immediately upon
12	enactment.
13	Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any
14	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall
15	not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect
16	without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this
17	Law are severable.
