Footnotes: 1/The bill if enacted will generate additional revenues for the Customs, Agriculture and Quarantine Inspection Services Fund (CAQISF) due to monetary penalties or fines applied to persons who intentionally make a false statement, either written or verbal, or who knowingly omits a statement of truth on an examination and questioning before a custom officer. Such person shall be guilty of a violation. A violation shall be punishable by seizure and forfeiture of any prohibited merchandise, cargo or baggage in addition to a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the first violation, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the second violation, and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for the third and all subsequent violations. All fines collected shall be deposited into the CAQISF. The anticipated impact collectable for just the first offense based on the monthly average of passengers arriving into Guam of 119,576, and if one forth of one percent (.0025%) which is equal to 299 passengers violate the law, the anticipated fines collectable annually is \$1,794,000 (119,576 passengers x .0025 = 299 violators x \$500 fine = \$149,500 x 12 mos. = \$1,794,000).

AN ACT TO REPEAL § 73127 AND TO REPEAL AND REENACT § 73130 OF CHAPTER 73 TITLE 5 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING FINES AND PENALTIES FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO MAKE FALSE STATEMENTS TO A GUAM CUSTOMS OFFICER.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 2 the Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency has been diligently working to ensure that 3 4 prohibited items, including illegal drugs, do not pass our borders. However, under 5 current Guam law, the Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency does not have the 6 ability to cite individuals who make false declarations or false statement to a Customs officer. Instituting fines will have the primary effect of reducing the number of 7 8 prohibited things that cross our borders, as well as the secondary effect of increasing 9 revenue for the Customs and Quarantine Agency.

10 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to discourage and properly 11 punish those who make false declarations and/or false statements to a Customs Officer 12 by instituting graduated fines by repealing §73127 and by repealing and reenacting 13 §73130 of Chapter 73, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated.

Section 2. §73127 of Chapter 73, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated is hereby
repealed:

"§ 73127. Declaration.

1	g + 5127. Declaration.
2	Any article not included in the declaration and entry as made, and, before
3	examination of the baggage was begun, not mentioned in writing by such
4	person, if written declaration and entry was required, or orally if written
5	declaration and entry was not required, shall be subject to forfeiture and such
6	person shall be liable to a penalty equal to the value of such article.
7	Section 3. §73130 of Chapter 73, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated is hereby
8	repealed and reenacted to read:
9	"§ 73130. False Swearing Statements Prohibited.
10	Any person who shall intentionally swear falsely on an examination
11	before the Collector of Customs shall be guilty of a misdemeanor; and if he is
12	the owner, importer or consignee, the merchandise shall be forfeited or the
13	value thereof may be recovered from such person.
14	Any person who intentionally makes a false statement, either written or
15	verbal, or who knowingly omits a statement of truth on an examination and
16	questioning before a customs officer shall be guilty of a violation. Violation of
17	this section shall be punishable by seizure and forfeiture of any prohibited
18	merchandise, cargo, or baggage in addition to a fine of five hundred dollars
19	(\$500.00) for the first violation, one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the second
20	violation and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for the third and all subsequent
21	violations. All fines collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited into the
22	Customs, Agriculture and Quarantine Inspection Services Fund."
23	Section 4. The Director of Customs shall include in a prominent location of
24	the Guam Customs Declaration form the following:
25	"FALSE WRITTEN AND/OR VERBAL STATEMENTS PROHIBITED.

Pursuant to §73130 of Chapter 73, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, any person who is found guilty of making a false statement or omits a statement of truth to a Customs officer shall be subject to a fine of \$500.00 for the first offense, \$1,000.00 for the second offense and \$10,000.00 for the third and all subsequent offenses in addition to the seizure and forfeiture of prohibited merchandise, cargo or baggage."

6 Section 5. Effective Date. This act shall be effective immediately upon 7 enactment. The Director of Customs shall have one hundred twenty (120) days to 8 comply with Section 4 of this act.

9 Section 6. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any 10 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall 11 *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect 12 without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this 13 Law are severable.
