Comments

The intent of Bill 310-32 (LS) is to provide for the creation of a task force to establish physical fitness standards and annual assessment policies for uniformed public safety and law enforcement personnel. These standards and policies will be known as the "Fit to Serve And Protect Act of 2014". With the implementation of this Act, certain items will be required. As noted on the bill, items such as health screenings, skilled trainers to direct the fitness standards, proposed gym or gym membership to conduct maintenance programs will be required. There are well over 800 personnel in the public safety and law enforcement field. With the intent for all law enforcement personnel to participate in the program, there will be an annual fiscal impact to provide the supplies, equipment and other necessities to establish this program. To implement such a program, initial funding may require approximately \$100,000, taking into consideration the number of public safety and law enforcement personnel. Because the standards and policies have not be established, additional funding may also be required to implement and enforce the program. The bill does not identify a funding source.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §55104, §55104.1, §55104.2, §55104.3 TO CHAPTER 55, DIVISION 3, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PHYSICAL FITNESS STANDARDS AND POLICIES FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND LAW ENFORCEMENT UNIFORM PERSONNEL; AND SHALL HENCEFORTH BE KNOWN AS THE "FIT TO SERVE AND PROTECT ACT OF 2014".

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Fit to Serve and Protect Act of 2014. §55104 of Chapter 55,

3 Division 3 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is hereby added to read:

"§55104. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds 4 that Guam's public safety and law enforcement uniformed personnel must be 5 physically fit due to the potential need for these uniformed personnel to be able to 6 exert maximum efforts. Guam's public safety and law enforcement uniformed 7 personnel is sedentary in nature, without sufficient physical activity to maintain 8 9 levels of fitness for exertive efforts or general health. The overall average fitness level of these uniformed personnel suggests that officers achieve an acceptable 10 measure of physical fitness during academy training. However, without fitness 11 12 maintenance standards, these gains achieved in the academy are shortly lost.

13 It has been proven that there is a direct correlation between physical fitness, 14 good health, and performance productivity. Further, enhanced physical activity

and exercise prescription is one of the many variables that maximizes job 1 2 effectiveness and lessening risks of non-communicable diseases (e.g. cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancer). Thus, a critical aspect of the overall 3 preparation of well-trained law enforcement personnel include the establishment 4 and effective implementation of physical fitness standards and annual assessment 5 policy that will ultimately benefit each uniformed personnel; and just as 6 importantly ensure physical health for their personal benefit and the benefit of their 7 families. Each uniformed public safety and law enforcement official should be 8 encouraged to be both task-trained and physically fit at all times to more 9 effectively serve and protect the people of Guam. 10

Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to work with government 11 of Guam public safety and law enforcement entities in the formulation of physical 12 fitness standard and annual assessment policy that will further enhance the ability 13 of all uniformed personnel in carrying out their tremendous responsibility to the 14 public. This provision would require that the law enforcement agencies and 15 entities of the government of Guam establish internally and collectively a 16 government-wide physical fitness standard and annual assessment policy necessary 17 to ensure the health and safety of all uniformed public safety and law enforcement 18 officials in the conduct of their duties and responsibilities. 19

20 §55104.1. Short Title. This subchapter may be cited as the "Fit to Serve
21 and Protect Act of 2014."

§55104.2. Public Safety and Law Enforcement Physical Fitness Standard and Annual Assessment Policy.

(a) The government of Guam public safety and law enforcement entities
shall hereby collectively formulate a government-wide policy on the
establishment of physical fitness standards and annual assessment
policy applicable to men and women serving the community in

uniform as a public safety or law enforcement official. For purposes 1 2 of this Act, the applicable government of Guam public safety and law enforcement agencies shall include, but not limited to, the Judiciary of 3 Guam, Guam Police Department, Guam Fire Department, Department 4 of Corrections, Customs and Quarantine Agency, Jose D. Leon 5 Guerrero Commercial Port Authority Police, Office of the Attorney 6 General, and A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority Police and 7 Director of Agriculture. 8

- (b) The "Fit to Serve and Protect Task Force" (hereinafter referred to as 9 the "Task Force") is hereby created for the establishment of physical 10 fitness standards and annual assessment policy for government of 11 Guam uniform public safety and law enforcement officials. 12 Guam Police Department, through the Chief of Police or his designee, shall 13 spearhead the formulation of such standards and policies through the 14 provision of administrative or other support deemed necessary, and 15 shall work in conjunction with other public safety and law 16 enforcement entities on island. The Chief of Police or his designee 17 shall serve as the Chairperson of the Task Force and shall ensure 18 timely completion of the physical fitness standards and annual 19 20assessment policy.
- (c) The Chief of Police, the Chiefs, law enforcement administrators, and
 administrators identified in subsection (a) of §55104.2, wherever
 applicable, shall appoint a uniformed representative who shall serve as
 a member of the Task Force. Such appointments shall be made no
 later than Thirty (30) days following the enactment of this provision.
 The Chief of Police shall be responsible for ensuring the timely
 empanelling of Task Force members and the completion of the

objectives of the Task Force as outlined in this Act. The Judiciary of
Guam, Guam Fire Department, Department of Corrections, Customs
and Quarantine Agency, Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port
Authority Police, A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority
Police, and Director of Agriculture shall forward their appointees for
the Task Force to the Chief of Police in the time required.

- (d) The standards and annual assessment policy identified herein shall be 7 accepted and completed by Task Force members no later than One 8 Hundred Eighty (180) days following the enactment of this Act. Upon 9 completion, the physical fitness standards and annual assessment 10 policy shall be presented to I Maga'lahen Guåhan. Within Thirty(30) 11 days of receipt, I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall approve and present to the 12 I Liheslaturan Guahan for consideration and official adoption. The 13 government-wide fitness standards and annual assessment policy to be 14 created shall include, but not limited to, the following: 15
- 161) A three-to-five year implementation plan demonstrating long-17term commitment to physical fitness/health for employees; and
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 2) A health related orientation, including screening procedures,
 individualized exercise programs, and appropriate follow-up
 activities; and

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- Identification of a person skilled in prescribing exercise to direct the fitness standard.
 - An approach that will consider key health behavior related to degenerative disease, including smoking and nutrition.
- 5) A modest facility or gym membership benefits that includes
 only the essentials necessary to conduct a maintenance program
 involving: cardiovascular endurance, anaerobic power,

- muscular strength, muscular endurance, flexibility, and body 1 composition. 2 6) Provision for equal opportunities for men and women, and all 3 employees regardless of grade or step level. 4 (e) The Task Force, upon formal acceptance and adoption of the fitness 5 standards and annual assessment policy by I Liheslaturan Guahan 6 shall thereafter dissolve. 7 §55104.3. Annual Reporting Timeline 8 The Director of Administration shall perform the review and report 9 described in Title 10 GCA, Chapter 55, Division 3, §55104 on an semi-annual 10 basis during the month of July, beginning July 1, 2015." 11 Section 3. Severability. 12 If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance 13 is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other 14 provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid 15 provisions application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable. 16
- 17 Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall be immediately effective upon18 enactment.
