Comments on Bill No. 207-33 (COR)

The intent of the proposed legislation is to add a new §23103.1 and to amend §§ 23101, 23103, 23104, 23108, 23109, and 23111 all of Chapter 23, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to prohibiting Legislative travel at government expense.

Section 4 of the proposed legislation adds a new § 23103.1 which will prohibit members of the Guam Legislature from traveling at government expense paid by any autonomous, semiautonomous and non-autonomous agencies and public corporations of the government of Guam.

Sections 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 and 8 amends §§ 23101 Definition, 23103 Persons Authorized to Travel at Government Expense, 23104 Per Diem Allowance, 23108 Reporting and Accounting, 23109 Rules and Regulations, and 23111 The Senator Edward J. Cruz Medical Referral and Education Mileage Program eliminating the members of the Guam Legislature.

Based on information obtained from the Guam Legislature's Citizen Centric Reports for FY2010-FY2014 and FY2015 information provided by the Guam Legislature, average annual expenditures for travel between FY2010 and FY2015 is approximately \$61,565. Should travel by legislative staff be prohibited per the subject legislation, estimated per annum costs to the Government of Guam would be reduced by this amount.
