Comments on Bill No. 298-33 (COR)

The intent of the proposed legislation is to add two (2) new Articles, Article 6 and 7 to Chapter 3, Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated. The Article 6 is relative to the Guam Family Medical Leave Act; and Article 7 is relative to Child School-Related Leave.

Section 1, Article 6 §3602 relative to the Eligibility Requirements (a), reduces the number of hours of service with the employer from 1,250 hours as stated on the U.S. Department of Labor, Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA) to 1,000 hours to take up to a total of 12 workweeks in any 12 month period for family care and medical leave. This is a difference of 250 hours which equates to approximately 31 work days less to qualify. Eligibility Requirements (b), reduces the number of employees an employer employs to grant the request for FMLA from 50 to fewer than 25 employees and shall not be unlawful for an employer to refuse to grant such request.

Section 2, Article 7 §3703 adds the Leave for Child School-Related Purposes. §3703 (a) (1) relative to the Leave for child school-related purposes, an employer shall not discharge or discriminate against an employee who is a parent of one or more children to take up to 40 hours each year for the following child-related activities; to enroll or reenroll the child in school or licensed child care provider or to participate in the activities, and to address a child care provider or school emergency

Should the Bill become law it will establish the Guam Family Medical Leave Act similar to the U.S. Department of Labor, Family Medical Leave Act and the Child School-Related Leave Act similar to the Parental Involvement created via E.O. 98-20. There will be a financial impact on the Government of Guam which cannot be determined at this time absent additional information from the Department of Administration.

However, it should be noted that should department heads fill positions left temporarily vacant by employees who take leave pursuant to provisions therein, detailed employees who serve beyond thirty (30) days are compensable for that period pursuant to the Government of Guam's Personnel Rules and Regulations.
