1/ Bill 329-33 (COR) proposes to appropriate a total of \$25,000 from the FY2017 Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) revenues to the Department of Administration. The FY2017 Executive Budget proposes to collect \$39,395,581 in TAF revenues. However, it should be noted that projected FY2017 TAF revenues are fully earmarked. Should the proposed legislation become law, it may reduce funding for departmental operations in FY2017.
