Comments

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) provided its comments on Bill 378-33. The OAG noted the bill will create a new criminal offense under the Family Violence law. The proposed bill may affect OAG's Prosecution & Juvenile Divisions and may also affect its Victim Service Center. The fiscal impact will be minimal as they already handle these types of cases. The fiscal impact may be with the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund (CICF) if victims or witnesses are injured by the defendant and claim compensation from the CICF via the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. Public Law 20-55 created the CICF. The source of funds for the CICF are from prosecuted criminals (offenders) and Government Appropriations. However, based on feedback from the OAG, the impact may be minimal at best.
