### Comments on Bill No. 85-33 (COR)

Bill 85-33 intends to authorize the Guam Regional Transit Authority (GRTA) to enter into a long-term Public-Private Partnership (PPP) to provide an effective and efficient public transit system. The PPP will require the private partner to implement the Transit Business Plan 2009-2015. Per GRTA, the Plan reports that approximately \$20M would be needed to upgrade facilities and to procure fifty (50) new transit buses. They have also noted that this amount may be less due to the changes with regard to the military build-up which was incorporated in the Transit Business Plan.

The bill proposes to create a Public Transit Task Force to plan for the solicitation and selection of interested parties for an investor-financed contract.

The bill proposes to also amend several sections of Chapter 6 of 12 GCA which will change the scope of responsibilities of GRTA. GRTA's responsibilities will change from an operational position to overseeing and administering the program. With the change in responsibilities and financial requirements being moved from the Government of Guam to the Private Partner, funding from the Guam Highway and Public Transit Funds may be reduced and / or eliminated for the operations of the public transit system. A review of current positions may also be required to determine the need of certain positions with the proposed changes in GRTA's scope of work with the implementation of a PPP.

In FY 2014, expenditures from the Guam Highway Fund and the Public Transit Fund totaled \$3,302,457. FY 2015 appropriations from these two (2) funds equals \$3,592,116 and GRTA projects to expended the full amount by September 30<sup>th</sup> and approximately \$5.2M was requested in the Governor's FY 2016 Executive Budget Request for GRTA operations.

Lastly, it should be noted that any cost savings from a PPP would be offset by any investment incentives to potential bidders (i.e., tax rebates, revenue sharing, discounted land rental, etc.) which may be offered in the finalized contract.
