Won Pat International Airport Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, and the Guam Visitors Bureau.
- (3) This report and corresponding Microsoft Excel file *shall* be filed with *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* no later than twenty (20) days after the end of each month of Fiscal Year 2014.
- (b) All health insurance carriers for the government of Guam *shall* file a monthly written report detailing each individual health insurance premium payment received by the government of Guam health insurance carrier from the government of Guam, by date and by agency to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than* twenty (20) days after the end of each month of Fiscal Year 2014.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

A memo identified as HRD No. OG-13-727 was sent to the Legislature, from the Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team identifying two options for medical and dental coverage for the government of Guam employees, retirees and their families. In light of the recent veto by the Governor of Substitute Bill 38, a contract for FY2014 health insurance might be entered into prior to the passage of the FY2014 Budget Act.

Public law requires that the most economical and beneficial health insurance plan be selected for the government of Guam employees, retirees and their families. Bill No. 174-32 (15) will provide the appropriate funding to enter into such a contract.

I hereby request that the public hearing for Bill No. 174-3 (Ls) An Act making Appropriations for Medical and Dental Insurance Premiums for employees of the Executive and Legislative Branches and for Retirees of the Government of Guam for Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2014" be waived pursuant to Section 6.04 of the I Mina trentai Dos na Liheslaturan Guahan Standing Rules and Section 2103 of Title 2 Guam Code Annotated. It is critical that the Legislature act quickly to ensure that the government of Guam promptly funds health insurance for FY2014 in order that appropriate contracts for employees' and retirees' health insurance are adequately funded and certified. Funding the most economical and beneficial health plan for the government of Guam health insurance program will ensure that other critical government operations, including health, education and public safety, be preserved for FY2014 pending the enactment of a budget bill.

A memo identified as HRD No. OG-13-727 was sent to the Legislature, from the Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team identifying two options for medical and dental coverage for the government of Guam employees, retirees and their families. In light of the recent veto by the Governor of Substitute Bill 38, a contract for FY2014 health insurance might be entered into prior to the passage of the FY2014 Budget Act.

Public law requires that the most economical and beneficial health insurance plan be selected for the government of Guam employees, retirees and their families. Bill No. 174-32 (13) will provide the appropriate funding to enter into such a contract.

I hereby request that the public hearing for Bill No. 174-3 (Ls) An Act making Appropriations for Medical and Dental Insurance Premiums for employees of the Executive and Legislative Branches and for Retirees of the Government of Guam for Fiscal Year ending September 30, 2014" be waived pursuant to Section 6.04 of the I Mina trentai Dos na Liheslaturan Guahan Standing Rules and Section 2103 of Title 2 Guam Code Annotated. It is critical that the Legislature act quickly to ensure that the government of Guam promptly funds health insurance for FY2014 in order that appropriate contracts for employees' and retirees' health insurance are adequately funded and certified. Funding the most economical and beneficial health plan for the government of Guam health insurance program will ensure that other critical government operations, including health, education and public safety, be preserved for FY2014 pending the enactment of a budget bill.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR MEDICAL AND DENTAL INSURANCE PREMIUMS FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES AND FOR RETIREES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2014.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 that the selection of the healthcare insurance plan for the government of Guam 3 employees and retirees by I Maga'låhen Guåhan shall represent the most 4 economical and beneficial healthcare insurance proposal. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 5 further finds that I Maga'låhen Guåhan's selection and intent to contract with the 6 7 non-exclusive healthcare insurance proposal for government of Guam employees and retirees is not the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance plan 8 according to the HRD. No . OG-13727 Memo submitted to I Liheslaturan Guåhan 9 from the Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team, as the 10 exclusive healthcare insurance proposal offered government of Guam savings of 11 Eighteen Million Seven Hundred Seventy Four Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty 12 Dollars (\$18,774,860) as compared to the non-exclusive healthcare insurance 13

proposal savings of approximately One Million Sixty Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Four Dollars (\$1,060,684).

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that such decision made by I Maga'låhen Guåhan represents an injustice to the government of Guam employees and retirees as well as to the taxpayers of Guam such that I Maga'låhen Guåhan's decision to contract with the non-exclusive healthcare insurance proposal costs employees, retirees and all taxpayers almost seventeen (17) times more than if I Maga'låhen Guåhan decided to contract with the exclusive healthcare insurance proposal.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that the government of Guam employees and retirees are provided the most economical and beneficial healthcare insurance plan that can be negotiated by the Government of Guam Health Insurance Negotiating Team for Medical and Dental Insurance for Fiscal Year 2014 and to prevent *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* from making decisions based on other criteria moving forward. Furthermore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that these additional savings from selecting an exclusive contract for healthcare insurance for government of Guam employees and retirees may be directed toward government operations such as education, health, and public safety as well as for Hay Study pay increases and Cost of Living Allowances for government of Guam retirees.

Section 2. Government of Guam Health Insurance Program Appropriation.

(a) The sum of Five Million Seven Hundred Four Thousand Five Hundred Seventy Nine Dollars (\$5,704,579) is appropriated for medical and dental insurance premiums for fiscal year ending September 30, 2014 for the following agencies: Office of *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* (GOV), Commission on Decolonization (COD), Guam Ancestral Lands Commission (GALC), Veterans Affairs Office

- 1 (VAO), Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR), Civil Service
- 2 Commission (CSC), Department of Administration (DOA), Guam Election
- 3 Commission (GEC), Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT), Bureau of
- 4 Statistics and Plans (BSP), Department of Public Works (DPW), Contractors
- 5 License Board (CLB), Guam Board of Registration for Professional Engineers
- 6 (PEALS), Architects and Land Surveyors, Guam Police Department (GPD),

The sum of Sixteen Million Six Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Five Hundred Forty Six Dollars (\$16,625,546) is appropriated from the General Fund to the GGRF to pay for retiree group medical and dental insurance premiums to continue existing programs currently contained in the semi-monthly payments.

Section 4. Government of Guam Health Insurance Program Reporting.

- (a) All health insurance carriers for the government of Guam *shall* submit a monthly written report and corresponding Microsoft Excel file of said report to the Department of Administration and the Office of Finance Budget aggregating the:
 - (1) Enrollees, both subscribers and dependents, by active employee and retiree subscriber counts by plan by class by groups supported/paid by the General Fund, detailed by agency/department; and enrollees, both

subscribers and dependents, by active employee and retiree subscriber counts by plan by class by groups supported/paid by autonomous agencies of the government of Guam, detailed by autonomous agency.

- (2) Autonomous agencies within this Subsection *shall* include the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Waterworks Authority, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port, the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, and the Guam Visitors Bureau.
- (3) This report and corresponding Microsoft Excel file *shall* be filed with *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* no later than twenty (20) days after the end of each month of Fiscal Year 2014.
- (b) All health insurance carriers for the government of Guam *shall* file a monthly written report detailing each individual health insurance premium payment received by the government of Guam health insurance carrier from the government of Guam, by date and by agency to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than* twenty (20) days after the end of each month of Fiscal Year 2014.
- **Section 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
