1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Estimated Revenues for Fiscal Year 2014. Section 2 of  
3 Chapter I of Public Law 32-68 is hereby *amended*, to read:

4 "Section 2. Estimated Revenues for Fiscal Year 2014. *I Liheslaturan*

2 Section 2. Unified Judiciary of Guam Law Enforcement Pay  
3 **Adjustment.** A *new* §13 is hereby *added* to Chapter XI, Public Law 32-68, to  
4 read:

5 "Section 13. Unified Judiciary of Guam Law Enforcement Pay  
6 **Adjustment.** The sum of nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) is  
7 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Unified Judiciary of  
8 Guam to pay for the equitable implementation of the law enforcement pay  
9 adjustments pursuant to Public Law 29-105."

10 Section 3. Capital Improvements to the Mangilao Municipal  
11 **Market.** A *new* §14 is hereby *added* to Chapter XI, Public Law 32-68, to read:

12 "Section 14. Capital Improvements to the Mangilao Municipal  
13 **Market.** Two hundred nine thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$209,450)  
14 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Mayors' Council of  
15 Guam for capital improvement projects, to be overseen by the mayor of  
16 Mangilao, to the municipal market of Mangilao."

17 Section 4. Responsible Non-Profit Endowment Fund. A *new* §15 is  
18 hereby *added* to Chapter XI, Public Law 32-68, to read:

19 "Section 15. Responsible Non-profit Endowment Fund. There is  
20 hereby created a Responsible Non-Profit Endowment Fund, which shall be  
21 separate and apart from the general fund and all other funds. Funds  
22 deposited into the Responsible Non-profit Endowment Fund shall not be  
23 transferred to any other fund or used for any other purpose, except as

1 outlined herein. The Fund *shall* be subject to the authority of *I Maga'laha*  
2 *Guåhan* and *shall* be managed by the Lieutenant Governor, who is hereby  
3 authorized to establish any depository or investment accounts as may be  
4 necessary to generate a return from the corpus of the fund, in accordance  
5 Guam's Procurement Law. The Lieutenant Governor *shall* promulgate rules  
6 and regulations for the management of the fund and the awarding of grants  
7 from the fund, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law. Only the  
8 earnings from the Fund shall be used to provide grant funding to non-  
9 profits in accordance with this Section, with all corpus funds restricted to  
10 the allowances provided in this Section. Grants may be provided only to  
11 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations registered with the Department of  
12 Revenue and Taxation. The Lieutenant Governor is authorized to pursue  
13 501(c)(3) status for the Fund, in order that the Fund may receive charitable  
14 donations. Three hundred ninety thousand five hundred fifty dollars  
15 (\$390,550) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Responsible  
16 Non-Profit Endowment Fund to establish an initial fund corpus."

17 **Section 6. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application  
18 to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such  
19 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which  
20 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this  
21 end the provisions of this Act are severable.
