AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT THE **GUAM** REGIONAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY CREATE AN **EMERGENCY PUBLIC** TRANSPORTATION PROTOCOL IN CONSULTATION WITH THE GUAM HOMELAND SECURITY OFFICE OF CIVIL DEFENSE BY AMENDING §6105 OF ARTICLE 1 OF **CHAPTER** 6, TITLE 12, **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 **Section 1. Short Title.** This Act *shall* be referred to as the
- 3 "Responsible Emergency Public Transportation Protocol Act."
- 4 Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 5 finds that there is an urgent need for an emergency public transportation
- 6 protocol for families who do not have their own means of transportation to
- 7 safely get to a designated storm shelter in times of natural disasters. I
- 8 Liheslatura finds that the lack of public transportation to storm shelters puts
- 9 families at risk of harm and injury by walking during inclement weather
- 10 conditions, often times without proper weather attire to cope with the
- 11 elements. Children especially are at risk as their parents struggle to

	safeguard them while also bearing the load of household items necessary
2	for their shelter stay.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to ensure that the government safeguards the health and safety of the people with reliable transportation to a designated storm shelter, by requiring the Guam Regional Transit Authority to create an emergency public transportation protocol in consultation with the Guam Homeland Security Office of Civil Defense.

Section 3. Emergency Transit Route and Schedule. § 6105, Article 1, Chapter 6, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended*, to read:

"§ 6105. Powers.

(a) The Authority may:

- (1) Enter into contracts, leases, concession agreements and permits and to execute all instruments necessary or convenient in the exercise of its purpose and powers, including, without limitation, the purchase of liability and casualty insurance for Authority purposes, adopt a seal and sue or be sued in its own corporate name.
- (2) Plan public transit services, devise and follow schedules, operate facilities and terminals, and otherwise engage in the necessary actions to provide public transit service and public parking management.

(3) Acquire personal and real property through negotiation, grant, lease, or permit in accordance with the provisions and subject to the limitations of laws of Guam, including Chapter 5, Title 5, GCA, and hold and use any real and personal property necessary, convenient or useful for the carrying out of any of its powers pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, and to dispose of the same.

- (4) Receive and disburse Federal funds, submit project grant applications, program of projects to Federal agencies, and enter into formal agreements concerning projects with Federal agencies.
- (5) Employ agents and retain or contract for the services of qualified consultants, specialists or experts, as individuals or as organizations, to advise and assist the Authority and its employees, all of which may be accomplished without regard to the portion of the Personnel Laws relative to compensation.
- (6) Impose, prescribe, revise policies, and collect fees for the purposes of carrying commercial advertisement on real and personal property owned by the Authority or used in the provision of transit services pursuant to this statute.
- (7) Adopt such rules and regulations, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, as may be necessary for the

exercise of powers and performance of the duties conferred or 1 imposed upon the Authority or the Board. 2 3 Shall enter into contract with the Attorney General (8)4 to address legal issues. 5 (b) The Authority shall: Operate a system of public transportation. 6 (1)Create an emergency public transportation protocol 7 (2)in consultation with the Guam Homeland Security Office of 8 9 Civil Defense to be executed at such time that the Governor declares Guam to be in a condition of readiness necessary for 10 11 the activation of shelters, or its equivalent. Such protocol shall 12 include adjusted public transportation service routes, schedules, and frequencies to maximize the provision of 13 14 services to public transportation riders seeking storm shelter. All service fees and charges shall be waived throughout the 15 16 execution of this protocol. 17 Establish operational routes, schedules, fares and (3)policies consistent with the purpose of the Authority. Such 18 services may be altered or modified only after completing the 19 20 following: 21 (A) Public Outreach Notice. 22 provide notice no less than ten (10) working days before 23 the effective date of the proposed changes. Notices shall

The GRTA shall

be posted, made available and disseminated at the office of the GRTA and within vehicles used to provide the services of the GRTA.

- (B) World Wide Web Notice. The GRTA, no less than ten (10) working days before the effective date of the proposed changes, shall publish a World Wide Web (Web) page, available to the public via the GRTA website. The Web page link shall be highly visible on the GRTA's main web page, and should legibly state in bold letters, "Guam Regional Transit Authority Service Change Proposal".
- (C) Public Hearing Notice. The GRTA shall hold at least three (3) public hearings on proposed changes at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the proposed changes. One (1) of the public hearings shall be held in a location in northern Guam; one (1) of the public hearings shall be held in a location in central Guam; and one (1) of the public hearings shall be held in southern Guam.
 - (i) No public hearing shall be held unless notice of the hearing has been advertised in a newspaper of general circulation at least twice. The notices shall be

1	made five (5) working days and forty-eight (48)
2	hours prior to the first scheduled hearing.
3	(ii)Any interested party, in person or their
4	authorized representative, shall be afforded an
5	adequate opportunity to participate in the
6	formulation of the proposed changes through the
7	presentation of facts or arguments or the submission
8	of written data or views. All relevant matter
9	presented shall be documented by the GRTA and
10	officially submitted to the Board for disposition.
11	(D) Notices. All notices shall include the following:
12	(i) date of notice;
13	(ii) GRTA point of contact name, telephone
14	number and email;
15	(iii) effective date of proposed change(s);
16	(iv) all public hearing dates, locations and
17	times; and
18	(iv) summary of proposed change(s) to
19	established route, schedule fare or policy.
20	(E) Board Approval. The Board shall approve or
21	disapprove the proposed changes.
22	(F) Effective Date. No change(s) to established
23	operational routes, schedules, fare and policies shall be

effective until after compliance with the provisions of this

Section.

- (c) Nothing contained in this Section, or by implication in this Chapter shall be construed to be in any way in derogation or limitation of powers conferred upon or existing in the Authority or in the Board by virtue of the Organic Act and the laws of Guam."
 - **Section 4. Completion date.** The Guam Regional Transit Authority *shall* have an emergency public transportation protocol created, in consultation with the Guam Homeland Security Office of Civil Defense, within ninety (90) days after enactment of this Act.

Section 5. Appropriation.

- (a) The unexpended available balance of the FY-2014 budget of the Guam Regional Transit Authority *shall* be available until fully expended and *shall* be utilized to fund the provisions of this Act. At such time the available balance of the FY-2014 budget of the Guam Regional Transit Authority is fully expended, the difference for any shortfall in funding the provisions of this Act from the FY-2014 budget *shall* be supplemented and funded from the General Fund appropriation for the Guam Regional Transit Authority.
- (b) The Executive Manager of the Guam Regional Transit Authority *shall* include a specific item request for funding the provisions of this Act in the proposed FY-2015 Executive Branch budget request.

- Section 6. Effective date. This Act *shall* become immediately effective
- 2 upon enactment.
