RELATIVE TO EXPRESSING THE SUPPORT OF I MINA' BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN ON THE GRANTING OF DEBT RELIEF FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM PURSUANT TO U.S. PUBLIC LAW 108-88 AND TO SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF I MAGA'LAHEN GUAHAN FOR SUCH PURPOSE

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

WHEREAS, U.S. Public Law 108-88 authorized the President of
the United States of America to provide debt relief for outstanding
federal obligations by the government of Guam as of December 31,
2004; and

WHEREAS, the intent of U.S. Public Law 108-88 was patterned
after federal debt relief granted to the government of the United
States Virgin Islands; and

9 WHEREAS, U.S. Public Law 108-88 included the following
10 outstanding Government of Guam federal obligations as eligible for
11 debt relief consideration by President George W. Bush as follows:

1	(a)\$105 Million owed by the Guam Telephone Authority to the
2	U.S. Department of Agriculture for telephone infrastructure
3	improvements;
4	(b)\$9 Million owed by the Guam Waterworks Authority to the
5	U.S. Department of the Navy for water consumption;
6	(c)\$3 Million owed by the Guam Community College to the
7	U.S. Department of Education for the construction of a
8	student housing facility;
9	(d)\$40 Million owed by the Government of Guam in local
10	matching funds to the Department of Homeland Security for
11	Typhoon Chata'an (FEMA1426DR), and Super typhoon
12	Pongsona (FEMA1446DR) disaster assistance; and
13	WHEREAS, Governor Felix P. Camacho has determined that
14	more than \$60.5 Million of federal obligations identified for debt
15	relief by the government of Guam should be reconsidered as follows:
16	(a)\$393,223 to the U.S. Department of Agriculture;
17	(b)\$10,083,172 to the U.S. Department of Defense;
18	(c) \$1,931,985 to the U.S. Department of Education;
19	(d)\$6,571,676 to the U.S. Department of Health and Human
20	Services;
21	(e)\$24,610,025 to the U.S. Department of Homeland Defense –
22	Federal Emergency Management Agency;
23	(f) \$598,275 to the U.S. Department of Justice;

5 WHEREAS, Governor Felix P. Camacho will be traveling to 6 Washington, D.C. to request that these amounts be revisited with 7 Bush Administration Officials in a February 28, 2006 meeting of the 8 Interagency Group on Insular Areas; now therefore be it

9 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guahan* 10 does hereby, express its support to Governor Felix P. Camacho in his 11 efforts to seek debt relief from the Federal Government; and be it 12 further

13 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guahan* 14 does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, petition the Bush 15 Administration to revisit and approve the debt relief request 16 submitted by Governor Felix P. Camacho; and be it further

17 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guahan* 18 does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, request that the Bush 19 Administration provide parity to the people of Guam in the review of 20 this request; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attests to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President
