
BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN

WHEREAS, Kwang-ming Chen received his medical degree from the
National Taiwan University College of Medicine in 1956 and completed his
internship at National Taiwan University Hospital from 1956-1957; and

6 WHEREAS, after completing his residency in psychiatry in 1959 and 7 his residency in neurology in 1961 at the Department of Neurology and 8 Psychiatry at National Taiwan University, Dr. Chen served as Chief 9 Resident in neurology and psychiatry of the Department of Neurology and 10 Psychiatry at National Taiwan University from 1961-1962; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Chen served as an instructor in neurology and
psychiatry from 1962-1963 and as a lecturer in neurology from 1963-1964 at
the Department of Neurology and Psychiatry at National Taiwan
University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Chen completed his residency in neurology at the
 prestigious Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in Rochester, Minnesota
 from 1967-1970; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Chen first began his service to Guam as a Research
Scientist in Neurology at the Guam Research Center, Epidemiology Branch,
National Institute of Neurological Diseases and Blindness, National
Institutes of Health from 1964-1967; and

8 WHEREAS, Dr. Chen received his Guam Medical License in 1965 9 and first began practicing medicine at the Guam Memorial Hospital 10 ("GMH") on August 25, 1965; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Chen returned back to Taiwan and served as an
Associate Professor in Neurology and Psychiatry at the National Taiwan
University College of Medicine from 1970-1972; and

14 WHEREAS, upon his return to Guam, Dr. Chen has served as Staff Neurologist, GMH (1972-1978); Officer-in-Charge, Guam Research Center, 15 16 National Institute of Neurological Diseases and Stroke, National Institutes of Health (1978-1983); consultant in neurology, GMH (1979-1999); and 17 consultant with the Micronesian Health and Aging Study at the University 18 19 of Guam (1990-2005) and holds the distinction of being the first individual 20 of Chinese descent on the GMH Medical Staff and the first Neurology 21 Medical Director at GMH; and

WHEREAS, since 1964, Dr. Chen has been a research scientist with the National Institute of Health and has been stationed on Guam collaborating in the research on the etiology of Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) and Parkinsonism-Dementia Complex (PDC) of Guam,

known locally as Lytico/Bodig, and has provided care for hundreds of
 patients stricken with Lytico/Bodig; and

3 Lytico/Bodig WHEREAS, is the for chronic term а 4 neurodegenerative disorder highly prevalent in the native Chamorro 5 population of Guam for many decades and in which Lytico refers to a progressive paralysis that resembles ALS and Bodig exhibits characteristics 6 7 similar to PDC, which combines the tremor of Parkinson's disease with the 8 memory loss of Alzheimer's disease; and

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Chen has made over twenty (20) presentations,
10 throughout various parts of the world including Tokyo, Chicago, Manila,
11 New York, Taiwan, San Francisco, Washington DC and Guam, to help
12 educate others about Lytico/Bodig; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Chen has written or contributed to numerous
 scientific publications in prestigious international journals about
 Lytico/Bodig; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Chen was instrumental in forming the Lytico/Bodig
Association in 1982, whose objective it is to support patients and families of
patients afflicted with Lytico/Bodig on Guam; and

WHEREAS, in 2005, Dr. Chen authored a book titled *The Mysterious Diseases of Guam* which discussed the history, including the discovery,
identification and research on possible causes of Lytico/Bodig on Guam;
and

WHEREAS, in addition to all his accomplishments in the practice of medicine, Dr. Chen has been or is still currently a member of various organizations including the Neurological Society of Taiwan, the American

Academy of Neurology, the American Medical Association- Guam
 Chapter, the American Association of Neuromuscular and
 Electrodiagnostic Medicine, the Guam Medical Society and the Movement
 Disorder Society; and

5 WHEREAS, in December of 2005, Kwang-ming Chen retired from 6 the practice of medicine, thus ending more than 40 years of healthcare 7 service to the island of Guam and its residents; now, therefore, be it
