WHEREAS, Technical Sergeant Terry L. Tyler, United States Air Force, a career Noncommissioned Officer, came to Guam in March 2001 and was assigned to Andersen Air Force Base, and has since given unselfishly in promoting friendship between the United States Air Force and the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, during his two (2) outstanding tours of duty on Guam, Technical Sergeant Tyler became extremely involved in a number of military and community projects. In doing so, he has made a significant impact to the quality of life for the people of Andersen and Guam while also enhancing the natural beauty of our island paradise; and

- 4 WHEREAS, Technical Sergeant Tyler's stewardship to the base and the
- 5 island of Guam has been noteworthy to all who come in contact with him. He
- 6 has proven his commitment to be steadfast during countless events on and off
- 7 base as the Chief of Customer Support and as the Quality Assurance Inspector
- 8 for the 36th Civil Engineer Squadron; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Technical Sergeant Tyler's humanitarian efforts were
- 10 always evident by his actions. His time and energy were extraordinary in
- 11 recruiting his entire office and others from his squadron to help clean up
- 12 Guam's beaches and collect six thousand (6,000) car batteries, two thousand
- 13 (2,000) light bulbs, one thousand (1,000) cans of paint, and three hundred (300)
- 14 pounds of unused oil, including working countless hours during recovery and
- 15 clean-up efforts during the aftermath of several typhoons; and
- WHEREAS, Technical Sergeant Tyler's spirit of volunteerism is revealed
- 17 and continues while off-duty during weekends at the Guam Animals In Need
- 18 (GAIN) facility in Yigo in cleaning holdings areas, performing minor
- 19 maintenance, and caring for needy animals; and also in building three (3) new
- 20 homes with the Habitat for Humanity for families on island, he assisted in
- 21 installing windows, rebuilding closets, tiling and carpeting floors, including
- 22 performing minor electrical and plumbing discrepancies; and
- 23 WHEREAS, as a member of the Top-Four Organization, Technical
- 24 Sergeant Tyler provided outstanding support to Andersen Elementary School.
- 25 He was instrumental with the set up for the "Andersen Field Day", an event

1 that gave the children an entire day to enjoy many different types of events

2 that teach teamwork and promote camaraderie. He participated in many

3 fundraiser events that allowed his squadron to enjoy a Christmas party at the

4 Westin Hotel and Resort worth more than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00).

5 His efforts resulted in a resounding successful event for his squadron and

6 local businesses; and

WHEREAS, Technical Sergeant Tyler's volunteer services were also demonstrated when he assisted in an effort to correct long standing structural and safety problems at the Carmelite Sisters Convent and facilities. The Carmelite Sisters needed numerous infrastructure and aesthetic repairs to their convent and educational facilities. He also assisted with the exterior grounds maintenance, a task that took more than eight (8) hours to accomplish. Technical Sergeant Tyler's accomplishments are unsurpassed and his dedication to the local community and island will be far from forgotten; and

WHEREAS, the singularly distinctive accomplishments of Technical Sergeant Tyler reflect great credit upon himself, the island of Guam, and the United States Air Force; his presence will be missed by friends in the military, as well as the civilian community as he soon completes his tour on Guam; now, therefore, be it
