RELATIVE TO RESOLUTION OF MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE GUAM VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMUNITY-OUTBASED CLINIC (VACBOC) GUAM.

1	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
2	WHEREAS, more than 15,000 Veterans of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern
3	Marianas Islands, and the Freely Associated States of Micronesia are not receiving proper medica
4	care or timely medical treatment for service related conditions; and
5	WHEREAS, the Veterans of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands
6	and the Freely Associated States of Micronesia have served dutifully in the armed forces, many
7	times being put in harm's way, with some making the ultimate sacrifice, and are deserving of the
8	same level of services as their counterparts in American Samoa and those choosing to live abroad in
9	foreign countries who have access to a U.Ssponsored Veterans Clinic; and
10	WHEREAS, the VA clinic is not staffed with the medical professionals necessary to treat
11	disabling conditions or to allow continuous preventative or rehabilitative case such as that provided
12	in the VA Clinic located in the Republic of the Philippines; and
13	WHEREAS, Veterans must have access to priority medical care commensurate to the
14	assigned priority levels as defined in Title 38 U.S.C., CFR; and
15	WHEREAS, Veterans should be allowed treatment on a fee basis treatment within thirty
16	(30) days of their request for treatment; and
17	WHEREAS, Veterans should be authorized to travel aboard military aircraft such as that
18	afforded to Veterans in American Samoa; and
19	WHEREAS, Guam does not have a Veterans Medical Center forcing all Veterans to seek

treatment at the VA Clinic co-located with the U.S. Naval Hospital, Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Naval Hospital treats patients under Title 10, U.S.C. such as Active Duty, dependents, and retired military personnel, but does not offer treatment to VA benefit recipients under Title 38 U.S.C.; and

WHEREAS, there is no emergency medical facility for veterans who are non-military retirees; and

WHEREAS, there is no written standard for those who are treated on an emergent basis, or after the emergent period expires, who need follow-up care; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the solution for this problem on Guam would be to allow Veterans on Guam to have the same services provided as are accessible at the VA Facility located in Manila, Philippines; and be it further

RESOLVED, in cases of extensive medical care, Veterans should be allowed to travel to Honolulu for treatment at its VA medical facilities, with the accompanying spouse allowed to travel with the Veteran with an allowance for lodging and a per diem paid by the VA during the period of treatment; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Executive Committee of *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam express its support for the extension of these services to Veterans of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands, and the Freely Associated States of Micronesia; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Executive Committee certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Jim Nicholson, Secretary, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; to the Honorable Steven Buyer, Chairman Committee on Veterans' Affairs, U.S. House of Representatives; to the Honorable Larry Craig, Chairman, Committee on Veterans' Affairs, U.S. Senate; to the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Member, U.S. House of Representative; to Mr. Jesse Pangelinan, Commander, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2917 Agat; to Mr. Donald McLaine Commander, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1509, Dededo; to Mr. Jack Shimizu, Commander, Order of the Purple Heart; to Mr. William R. Flores, Commander, American Legion Post 1; to Mr. John Finona, President, Vietnam Veterans Association, Chapter 668; and, to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
