## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN

2 GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, April 2006 is the locally and nationally recognized month to

4 celebrate Autism Awareness; and

1 WHEREAS, autism is a severely incapacitating, lifelong disability, resulting in significant impairment of an individual's ability to learn, develop 2 3 appropriate social skills, and understand verbal, nonverbal, and reciprocal 4 communication; and

WHEREAS, autism is a spectrum disorder that affects each person 5 differently and to varying degrees of severity; and 6

7 **WHEREAS**, autism is four (4) times more prevalent in boys than in girls and knows no racial, ethnic, or social boundaries; and 8

9 WHEREAS, family income, lifestyle, and educational levels do not 10 affect the chance of autism's occurrence; and

11 WHEREAS, today, autism spectrum disorders are even more common than Downs Syndrome, Diabetes, Muscular Dystrophy, Cystic Fibrosis, and 12 many forms of childhood cancer; and 13

14 WHEREAS, there are more than one million five hundred thousand (1,500,000) people with autism in the United States and approximately one 15 hundred ten (110) individuals with autism on the island of Guam; and 16

WHEREAS, the recently released Center for Disease Control and 17 18 Prevention report found that autism spectrum disorder occurred in one in every one hundred sixty six (166) children; and 19

20 WHEREAS, accurate, early diagnosis before three (3) years of age, and 21 the resulting appropriate education and intervention are vital to the future 22 growth and development of individuals with autism; and

23 WHEREAS, through accountable training, knowledge, materials, 24 programs, increased awareness, and support groups, we will be empowered and ready to meet the challenge of meeting the growing population of
 individuals with autism spectrum disorders; and

3 WHEREAS, through the increased services available to individuals with 4 autism, the lives of our friends with autism can be made easier, while those 5 without autism can expand their understanding of the needs and challenges 6 that individuals with autism experience; and

WHEREAS, parents, support groups, researchers, and professionals,
have dedicated years in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights,
humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons with autism; and

10 WHEREAS, these groups remain committed to their cause by setting 11 new standards, researching causes and effects, and educating families, other 12 professionals, and the general public to better understand this lifelong 13 disability; and

WHEREAS, here on Guam, AUTISM COMMUNITY TOGETHER (ACT), a
parent support group, is dedicated to advocating for the rights of all persons
with autism; and

WHEREAS, AUTISM COMMUNITY TOGETHER (ACT), formed in January
2004, is spearheading an effort to educate parents, professionals and the
general public about autism and its effects; now, therefore, be it
