Relative to recognizing the week of January 30 to February 6, 2005 as Guam Animal In Need's (GAIN's) "Spay And Neuter Week", and also to recognizing the many individuals, organizations and corporations that are donating their time, effort and money in support of this program.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, cats and dogs provide companionship for and share the 4 homes of many Guam residents, and many of these pets are considered 5 members of their respective families; and WHEREAS, unfortunately a large number of cats and dogs have no
 homes or are considered by their owners to be "outside" animals, being
 allowed to roam freely, producing hundreds of unwanted puppies and kittens
 each year; and

5 WHEREAS, although Guam Animals In Need (GAIN) accepts 6 unwanted dogs, cats, puppies and kittens each year, limited space and 7 resources necessitate that ninety percent (90%) to ninety-five percent (95%) of 8 the animals received at the shelter must be euthanized; and

9 WHEREAS, the problem of pet over-population costs Guam taxpayers 10 thousands of dollars annually through animal control programs, health care 11 problems associated with bites and allergies, as well as cleaning up the 12 unhealthy litter problem that uncontrolled animals cause when they knock 13 over trash cans and dig through peoples' refuse; and

WHEREAS, spaying and neutering of cats and dogs has been shown todrastically reduce the cat and dog over-population; and

16 WHEREAS, veterinarians, Guam Animals In Need, private enterprises, 17 government agencies, and private citizens have joined together to advocate 18 the spaying and neutering of companion animals during the animal 19 sterilization clinic January 30-February 6, 2005; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, greet and recognize the week of January 30 to February 6, 2005 as GAIN's "Spay And Neuter Week," and salute the selfless and largely volunteer work of GAIN in helping to control the growth in number of unwanted pets in Guam; and be it further 1 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, 2 on behalf of the people of Guam, does further encourage all elected officials to 3 join with GAIN and observe this week by having their own cats or dogs 4 spayed or neutered or sponsoring the spaying or neutering of an unwanted 5 animal at GAIN as good examples for the entire community to emulate; and 6 be it further

7 **RESOLVED**, that I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, further recognize the following individuals, 8 9 organizations and corporations that have made this event possible: the GAIN 10 staff and volunteers; the Andersen Air Force Base Volunteers with Spay Week 11 Coordinator, Monika Crummett; Dr. Rebecca L. Diaz, Isla Veterinary Clinic; Northwest Airlines; Matson Navigation; Guam 12 Surgicenter; Island Equipment; GuamCell; Cost-U-Less; Guam Tropical Dive Station; Avis; 13 Micronesian Goldsmith; South Pacific Petroleum Corporation; Tropical Shine; 14 15 and Fence Masters; and be it further

16 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the 17 Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be 18 thereafter transmitted to Guam Animals In Need (GAIN); and to the 19 Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
