Relative to submitting comments to the Proposed Rules and Regulations of the Combined Federal Campaign under the auspices of the U.S. Office of Personnel Management, 5 CFR Part 950, for the inclusion of Guam to qualify and meet eligibility requirements for local non-profit charitable organizations.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) started in 1961, is administered by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management, is the nation's largest workplace charity drive and is the only philanthropic effort permitted by law in the federal workplace; and 1 WHEREAS, the mission of the CFC is to promote and support 2 philanthropy through a program that is employee focused, cost efficient, and 3 effective in providing all federal employees and military personnel the 4 opportunity to improve the quality of life for all; and

5 WHEREAS, as the world's largest and most successful annual 6 workplace charitable campaign, each year more than three hundred (300) CFC 7 campaigns throughout the country and internationally help to raise millions 8 of dollars; and

9 WHEREAS, according to a press release by the U.S. Office of Personnel
10 Management (OPM), in 2004, federal employees and military personnel
11 pledged nearly \$257 Million to the CFC; and

WHEREAS, pledges made by federal employees and military personnel donors during the campaign season (September 1st to December 15th) support eligible non-profit charitable organizations that provide health and human services benefits throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, the Director of OPM has delegated to the Office of CFC
Operations (OCFCO) responsibility for day to day management of the CFC;
and

WHEREAS, the OPM is currently soliciting comments for proposed changes to the Rules and Regulations which include changes in eligibility requirements, public accountability standards and several other parts for the CFC; and

WHEREAS, there are thousands of federal employees and military
personnel on Guam who generously contribute to the CFC; and

WHEREAS, non-profit charitable organizations on Guam do not 1 currently enjoy the benefits from the CFC; and 2

3 WHEREAS, non-profit charitable organizations on Guam provide necessary health and human services benefit to the community which 4 5 encompass all ages, race and culture; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the community of Guam, through non-profit 6 7 charitable organizations, should have the opportunity to reap the benefits of 8 the CFC, particularly those federal employees and military personnel who live and work on Guam and who choose to contribute to the CFC to improve 9 10 the quality of life on Guam; and be it further

RESOLVED, that I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan hereby 11 supports and submits comments to the proposed rules and regulations of the 12 Combined Federal Campaign under the auspices of the U.S. Office of 13 14 Personnel Management, 5 CFR Part 950, for the inclusion of Guam to qualify and meet eligibility requirements for local non-profit charitable organizations; 15 16 and be it further
