BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, cooking equipment was involved in one hundred eighteen
thousand seven hundred (118,700) reported structure fires, the largest share of

any major cause, of which seventy-five thousand three hundred (75,300) were
 reported as fires confined to the interior of a cooking device or appliance in
 2003; and

WHEREAS, cooking equipment structure fires in homes resulted in two
hundred fifty (250) civilian deaths, three thousand eight hundred eighty
(3,880) civilian injuries and Five Hundred Twelve Million Dollars
(\$512,000.00) in direct property damage in 2003; and

8 WHEREAS, in addition to the one hundred eighteen thousand seven 9 hundred (118,700) home structure fires involving cooking equipment, there 10 were an estimated three thousand seven hundred (3,700) reported outdoor 11 home grill fires in 2003; and

WHEREAS, statistics show that the leading factor in home cooking fires is leaving equipment unattended, which causes one-third of home cooking structure fires, excluding confined fires, and two-fifths of associated civilian deaths, followed by leaving combustibles too close to heat source and unintentionally turning on or not turning off the device; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Fire Department, in conjunction with Guam
International Airport Fire Rescue, Department of Agriculture Forestry
Division, Federal Fire Department and the Andersen Air Force Base Fire
Department, encourage our island community to join in the activities
scheduled during the month of October; and

WHEREAS, this year's theme: 'Prevent Cooking Fires: Watch What You Heat!', is aimed at informing the community that more fires start in the kitchen than in any other part of the home and teaching families and children how to keep cooking fires from starting in the first place; now, therefore, be it
